Introduction

This fact book presents data for all UNM campuses. UNM consists of a Main Campus located in Albuquerque, which includes all programs and departments that report to Academic Affairs and the Health Sciences Center. UNM also has four branch campuses, which have a two-year degree mission: UNM-Gallup, UNM-Los Alamos, UNM-Taos, and UNM-Valencia.

Founded in 1889, the University of New Mexico is the state's flagship research institution. UNM's Carnegie Basic Classification is "Research University with Very High Research Activity." As a Hispanic-Serving Institution[†], the University represents a cross-section of cultures and backgrounds. UNM research injects millions of dollars into New Mexico's economy, funds new advancements in healthcare, and augments teaching – giving students valuable hands-on training in state-of-the-art laboratories.

In Fall 2011, the campuses of the University of New Mexico served 36,742 students,* employed 3,711 faculty, 6,713 staff, and 4,936 students (an additional 5,959 staff work at University Hospital, 66 at the UNM Foundation, and 210 at the UNM Medical Group); and had a total operating and capital budget of about \$2.04 billion. In the previous academic year, UNM awarded 5,478 degrees and certificates. The Division of Continuing Education and Community Services serves more than 30,000 students annually in various non-credit or certificate courses, workshops, and training sessions. Approximately 200,000 community and UNM participants use the Conference Center facility each year.



[†]The Hispanic Association of Colleges & Universities (HACU) defines HSIs "as colleges, universities, or systems/districts where total Hispanic enrollment constitutes a minimum of 25% of the total enrollment. *Enrollment includes full-time and part-time students, by campus, at the undergraduate or graduate level (including professional schools) of the institution, or both (i.e., headcount of for-credit students).

New Federal Race & Ethnicity Reporting Rules

Beginning 2010

There are new Federal rules for collecting and reporting race/ethnic data as of Summer 2010. Individuals are now given the option of identifying their ethnicity as Hispanic or Non-Hispanic, and are also given the option of selecting one or more races. For Federal reporting, anyone who selects Hispanic is reported as Hispanic, regardless of any race choices they select. Anyone who selects Non-Hispanic and only one race (e.g., American Indian) is reported as that race, and anyone who selects Non-Hispanic and two or more races is reported as "Two or More".

For example: the American Indian total will include anyone who selected American Indian only. If an individual selected Hispanic and American Indian, they will be reported as Hispanic, and if they selected Non-Hispanic and American Indian and one or more additional race, they will be reported as "Two or More".

International faculty, staff and students are reported separately, rather than in any of the racial or ethnic categories.

These data are not comparable to data from previous years.

Campus Naming Conventions

Beginning 2011

Beginning with the 2011 version of the UNM Fact Book, a new standardized set of campus descriptors were adopted to provide for better consistency in reporting of the data. The descriptors are as follows:

UNM All Sites and Campuses: Formerly referred to as ***Total UNM or UNM (HSC & Branches)***, includes all programs, departments, faculty, and staff that report through any of the areas mentioned below.

Main Campus: Sometimes referred to as the “Albuquerque Campus,” includes all programs and departments that report to Academic Affairs and to the Health Sciences Center administrative areas. Branch campuses are excluded. This conforms to the National Center for Educational Statics (NCES) Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) terminology.

Academic Affairs: Includes all programs and departments that report through the Provost/Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs administrative areas, including Extended University, Continuing Education, and other sites such as UNM West (Rio Rancho). Branch Campuses and the Health Sciences Center are excluded.

Academic Affairs/Administrative Areas: For data pertaining to faculty and staff, includes those individuals reporting through the administrative areas of the Provost/Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs (as listed above), the Executive Vice President for Administration, and the President’s Office. Branch Campus faculty and staff are excluded.

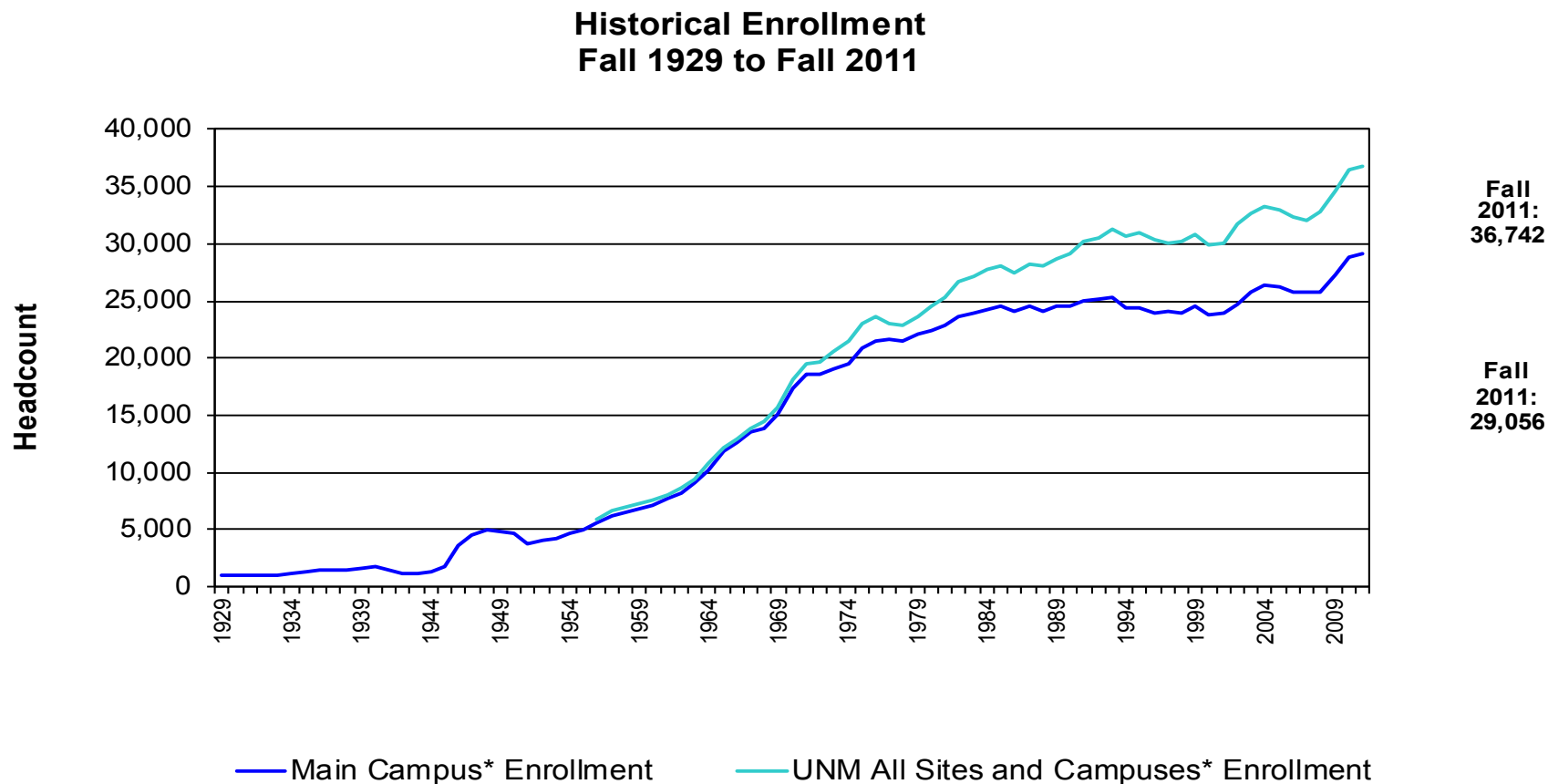
Health Sciences Center: Includes programs, departments, faculty and staff that report through the Health Sciences Center administrative areas, including the College of Nursing, College of Pharmacy, and School of Medicine. Branch Campuses are excluded.

Branches: Includes all programs, departments, faculty, and staff that report through any of UNM’s four Branch Campuses – UNM-Gallup, UNM-Los Alamos, UNM-Taos, and UNM-Valencia.

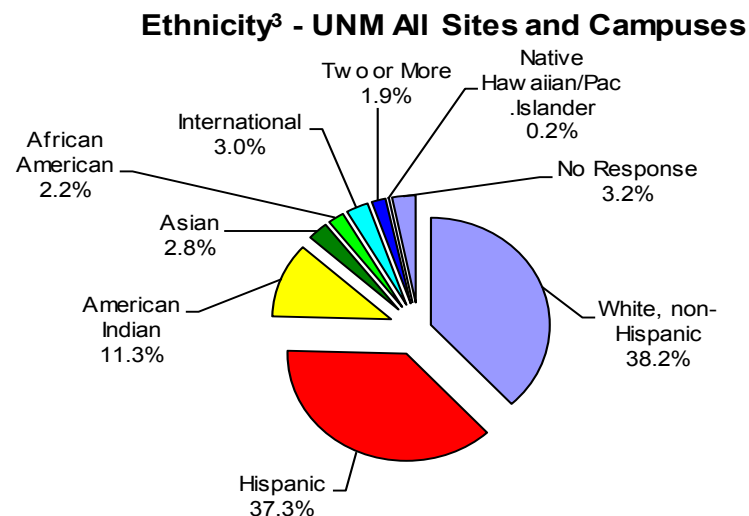
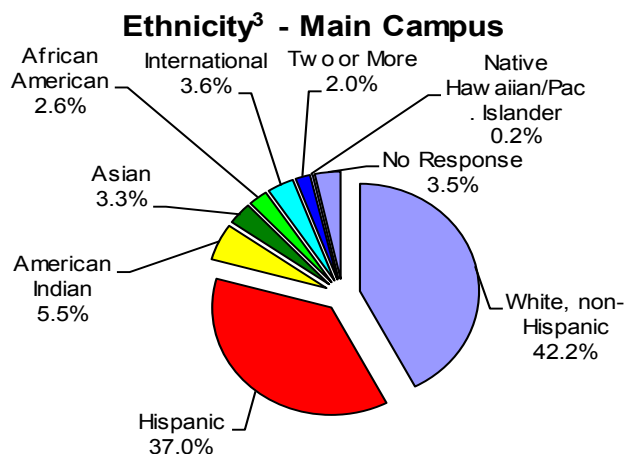

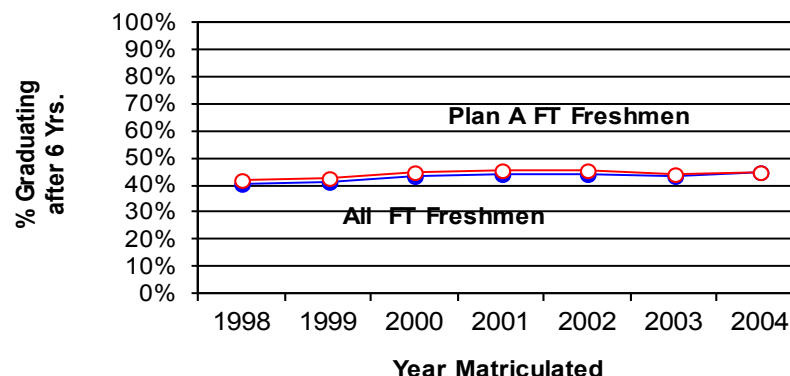

6-Year Graduation Rates Full-time Freshmen

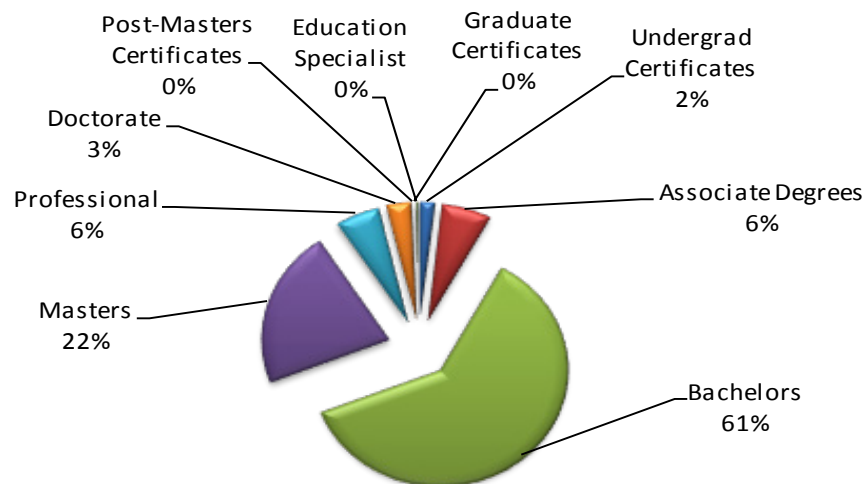

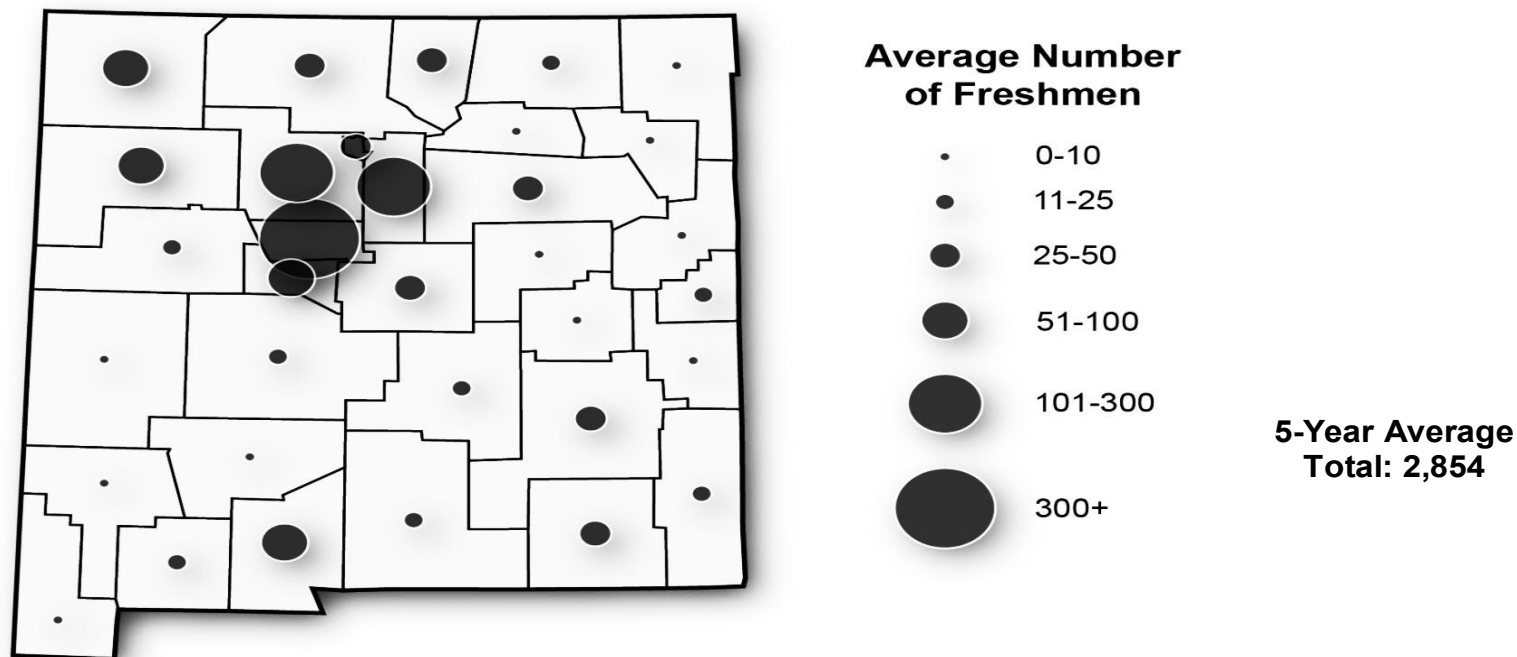

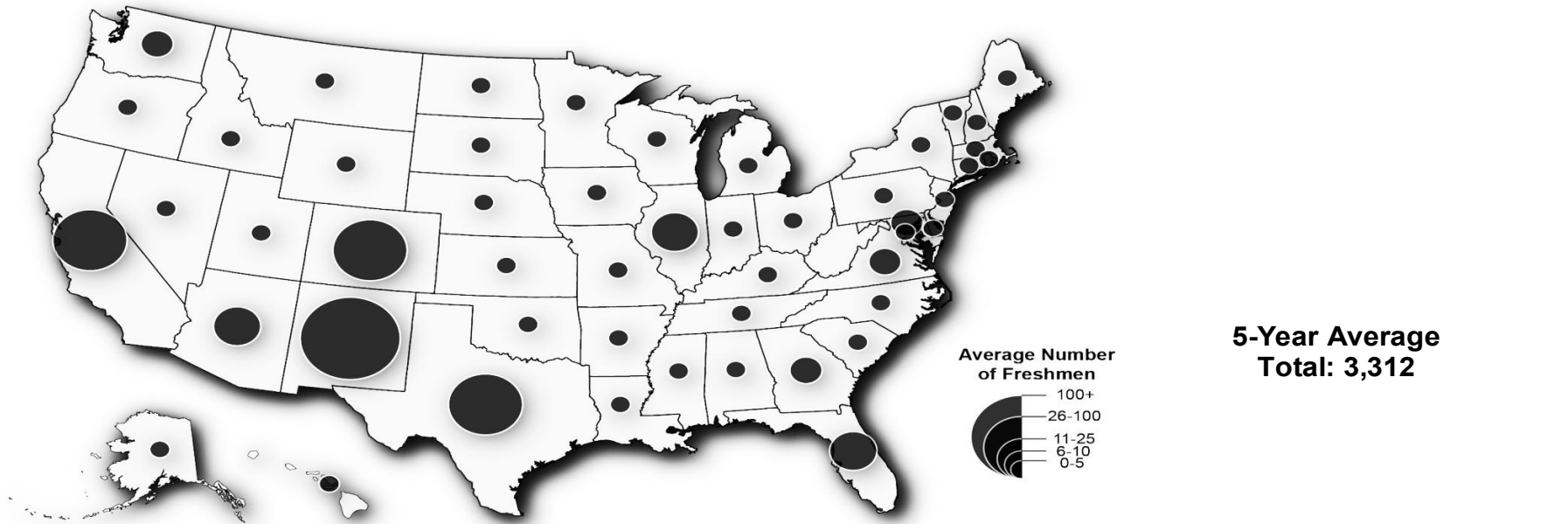

Degree & Certificate Programs (Main Campus¹)

UNM's Main Campus offers over 218 active degree and certificate programs. There are 87 baccalaureate, 72 masters, and 38 doctoral level degree programs. In addition, there are 4 doctoral professional practice programs—in law, medicine, pharmacy, and physical therapy—as well as 4 education specialist certificates (graduate programs beyond the masters level), 10 graduate certificate programs, 5 undergraduate certificate programs, and 1 associate degree program. Many of the degree programs have additional concentrations and options (see the UNM catalog for information on degree concentrations: http://registrar.unm.edu/UNM_Catalog/index.html).

The University offers an Evening and Weekend Degree Program (EWDP) in which nearly 40 majors and minors are available, and core courses are offered in a number of additional degree programs. About 1,000 classes are offered each semester after 4:00 p.m. or on weekends. Approximately 12,000 non-traditional, working students attend UNM at night each semester. The following list of degree programs are marked with an * if the entire program is available in the EWDP and with a + if several core courses in a program are offered through EWDP.

UNM also offers over 225 different courses and 280 sections online per semester. UNM's main campus offers approximately 17 online degree completion programs. There are approximately 7,286 duplicated enrollments (4,356 unduplicated students) in online sections. The following list of degree programs are marked with an ^ if the program is designated as an online degree program as reported to the Higher Learning Commission (where 50% or more of the courses within the program can be taken online). In addition to online offerings, UNM supports a variety of bachelor and graduate degree programs through face-to-face and interactive television (ITV) delivery at 7 locations around the state and offers approximately 55 different independent study options through correspondence courses.

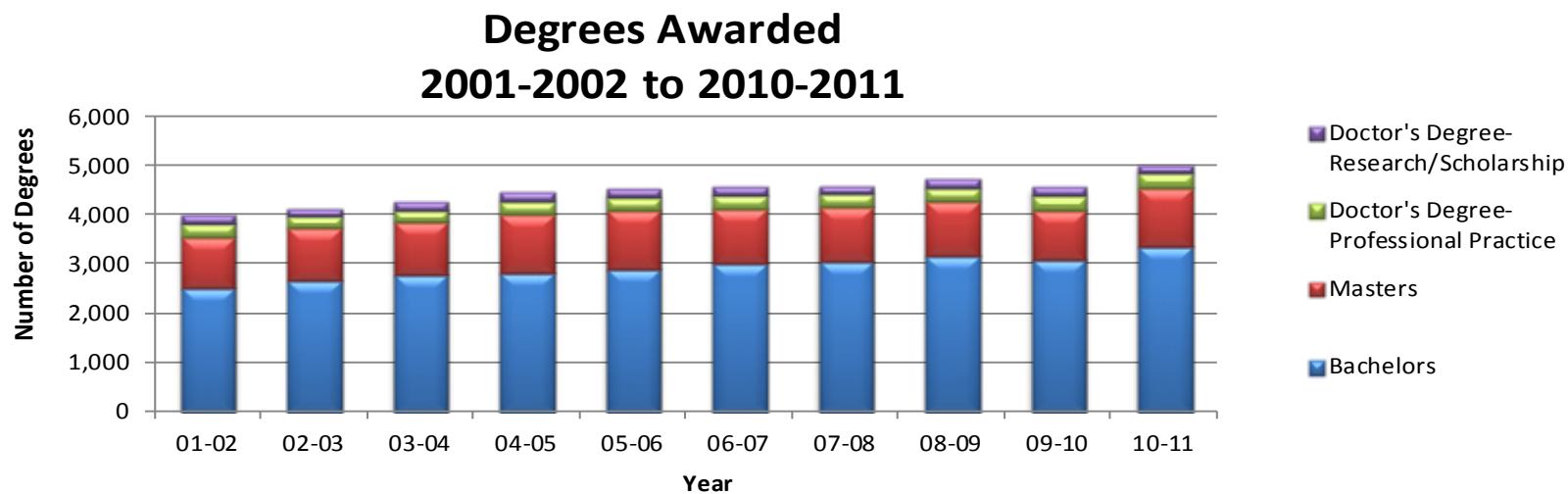

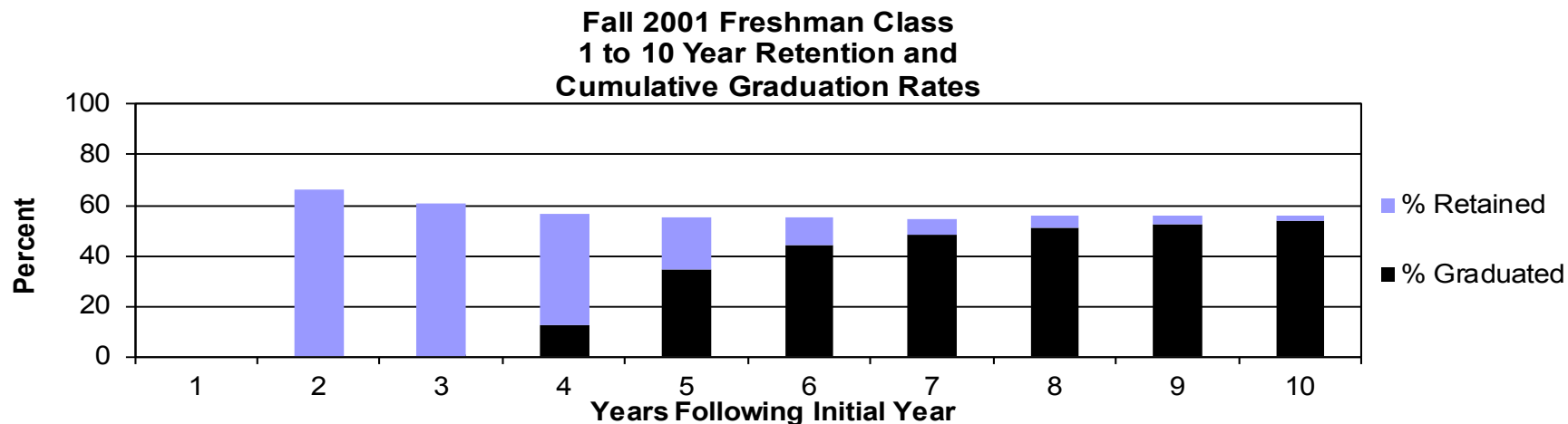

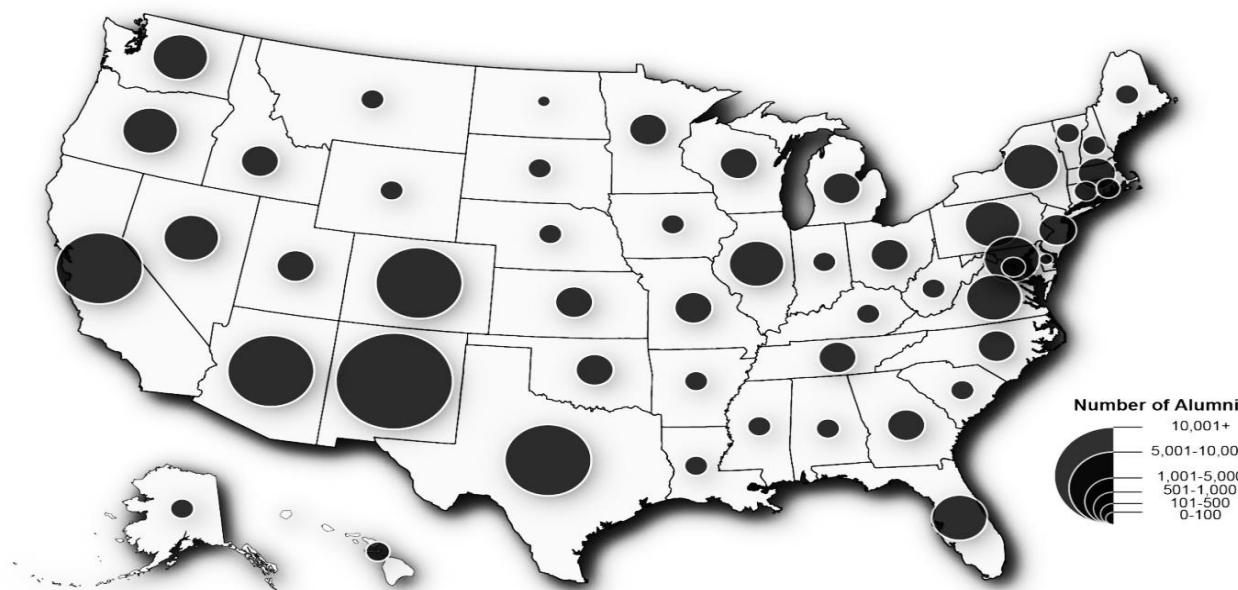

UNM Alumni by State*



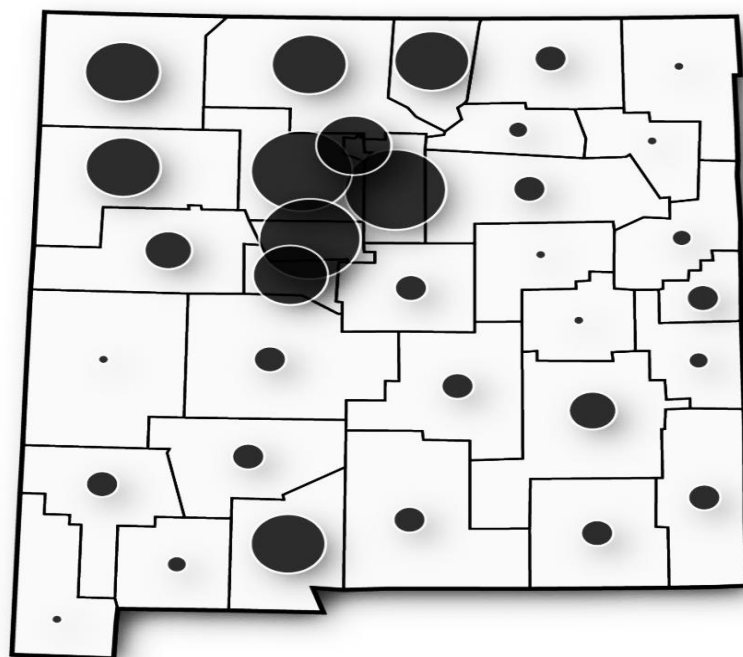

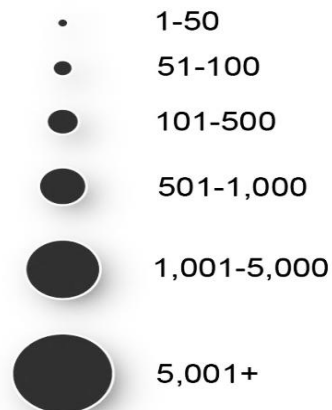

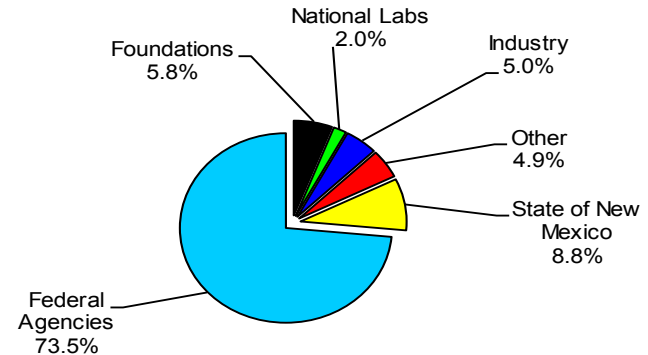

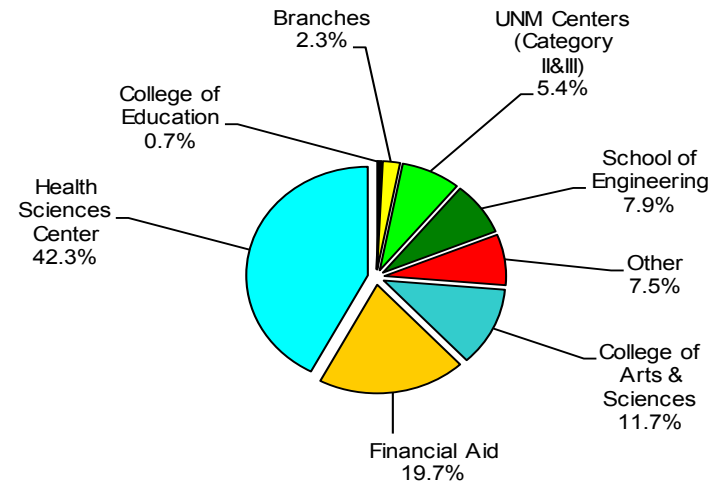

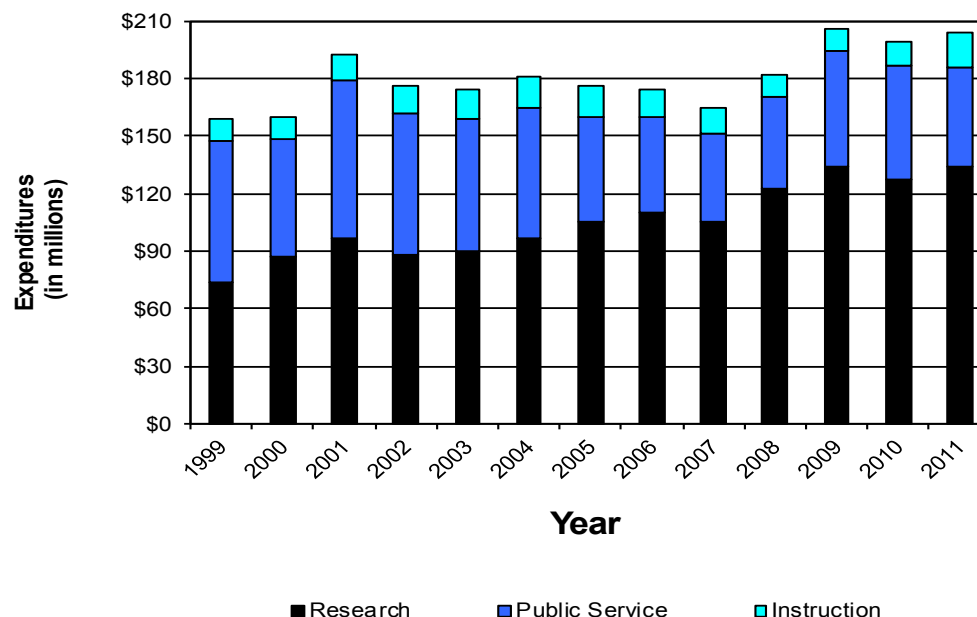

FY 1999 to FY 2011



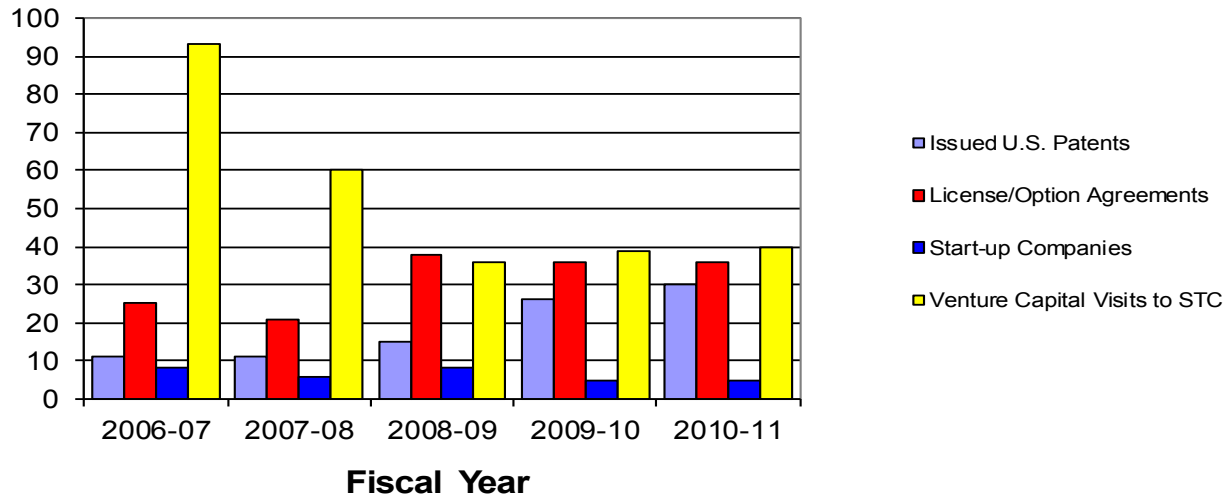

The mission of IT is to provide leadership for the effective use of information technologies to achieve the University of New Mexico's vision and mission in education, research, and public service, and to support the effective management and administration of those functions.

Information Technologies (IT) delivers UNM's enterprise computer and networking systems architecture, operations, applications and security used by all students, staff, and faculty.

- IT delivers, secures, monitors and manages the UNM voice and data networks, computer and storage resources.
- IT underwrites licensing for Microsoft software and negotiated the Dell contract, saving UNM close to \$400,000 in FY2011.
- IT manages computing environments such as WebCT, my.unm Portal, computer pods, software for departmental purchase, hardware maintenance, survey and election software, course evaluation and scanned test scoring.
- IT maintains and enhances Banner applications such as Student Admissions, Registration, Financial Aid, Human Resources, Payroll, and Finance, as well as reporting, Degree Audit and other Banner-related applications.

UNM Libraries

Overview: UNM Libraries include the University Libraries, the Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center and the Law Library. University Libraries is administered by the Dean of University Libraries who reports to the Provost and Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs. In the Health Sciences Center the Director of Library Support Services for the HSLIC reports to the Associate Vice President for Knowledge Management and IT and in the Law School the Associate Dean for Library and Information Technology reports to the Dean of the School of Law. The Bunting Visual Resources Library provides specialized collections to the College of Fine Arts and the School of Architecture and Planning.

University Libraries (UL): The University Libraries is the largest academic library system in the state with the most paper and electronic resources as well as the most space for students. The physical library is comprised of Centennial Science and Engineering Library, Fine Arts & Design Library, Parish Memorial Library for Business and Economics, and Zimmerman Library. The Center for Southwest Research & Special Collections located in the historic West Wing of Zimmerman Library houses significant resources on the Southwest and other collecting areas. The UL is a Government Information Depository Library. The UL provides 24/7 on-line services through an extensive set of web pages.

Law Library: The UNM Law Library houses the largest academic legal research collection in the State of New Mexico and is considered a “large” library under ABA accreditation standards. The library space consists of 32,443 square feet, encompassing two floors with beautiful views of the Sandia Mountains. During the academic year, the Library gate count reaches 10,000+ visits per month, with the Library open an average of 90 hours per week.

Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center (HSLIC): The Health Sciences Library and Informatics Center is the only federally-designated resource library to serve the health information needs of New Mexico. The HSLIC serves the Colleges of Pharmacy and Nursing as well as the School of Medicine, Biomedical Sciences Graduate Program, and Diagnostic & Therapeutic Sciences Programs. HSLIC serves approximately 9,000, including faculty, students, staff and preceptors across the state. HSLIC is open 357 days a year. Over 200 health-related organizations and individual health professionals throughout New Mexico receive specialized services through outreach memberships and other programs.

Bunting Visual Resources Library: The Bunting Visual Resources Library is a combined collection of over 360,000 digital images, color and black and white slides, and mounted photographs illustrating the history of art and architecture from prehistoric times to the present. Named in honor of Dr. Bainbridge Bunting (1913-1981), professor of architectural history at the College of Fine Arts from 1948 until 1978, the facility has grown from a personal collection housed in his office, to an integrated, organized educational resource incorporating the latest in images and technology.

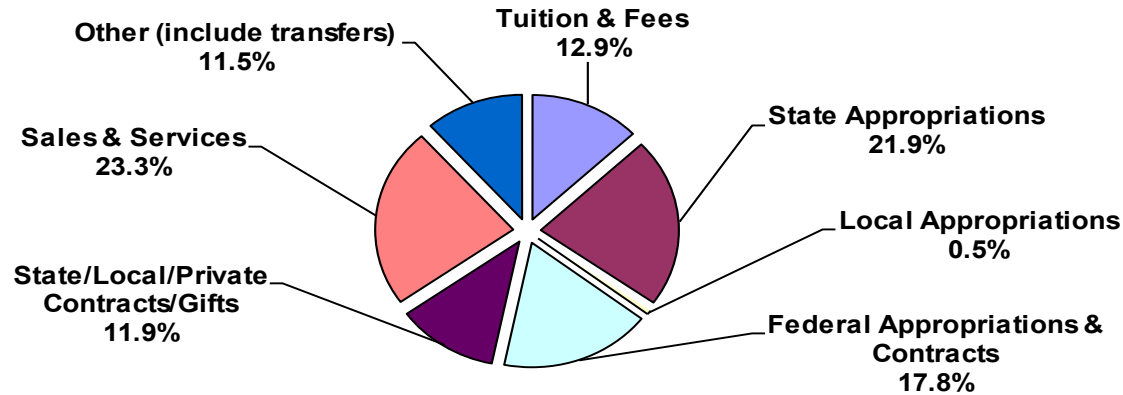

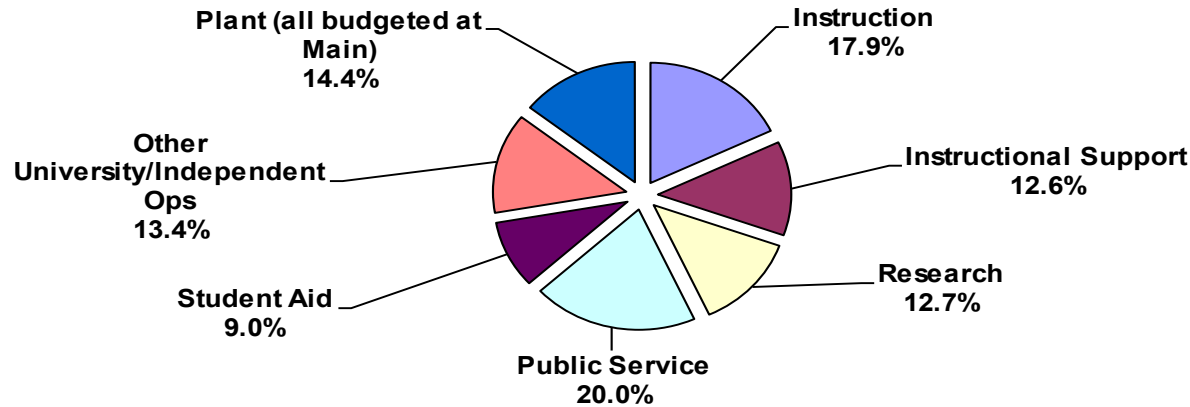

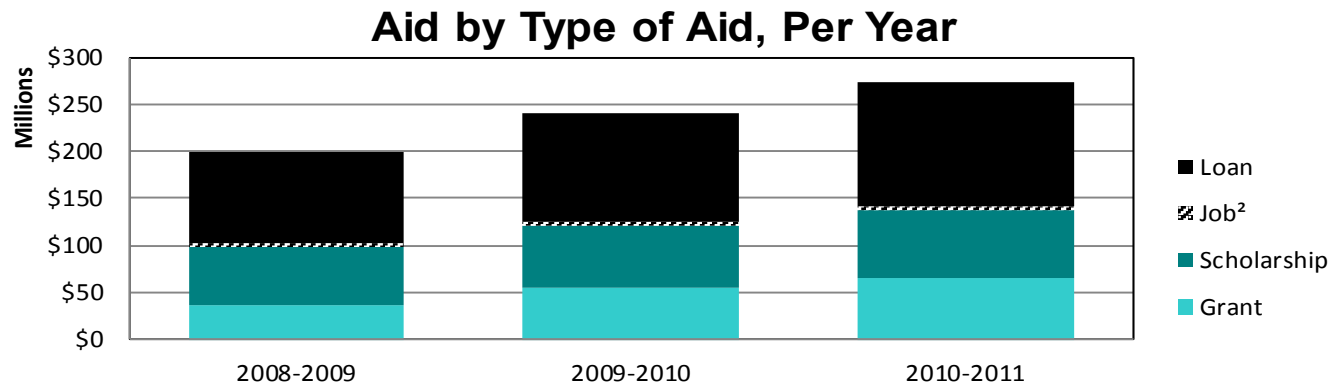

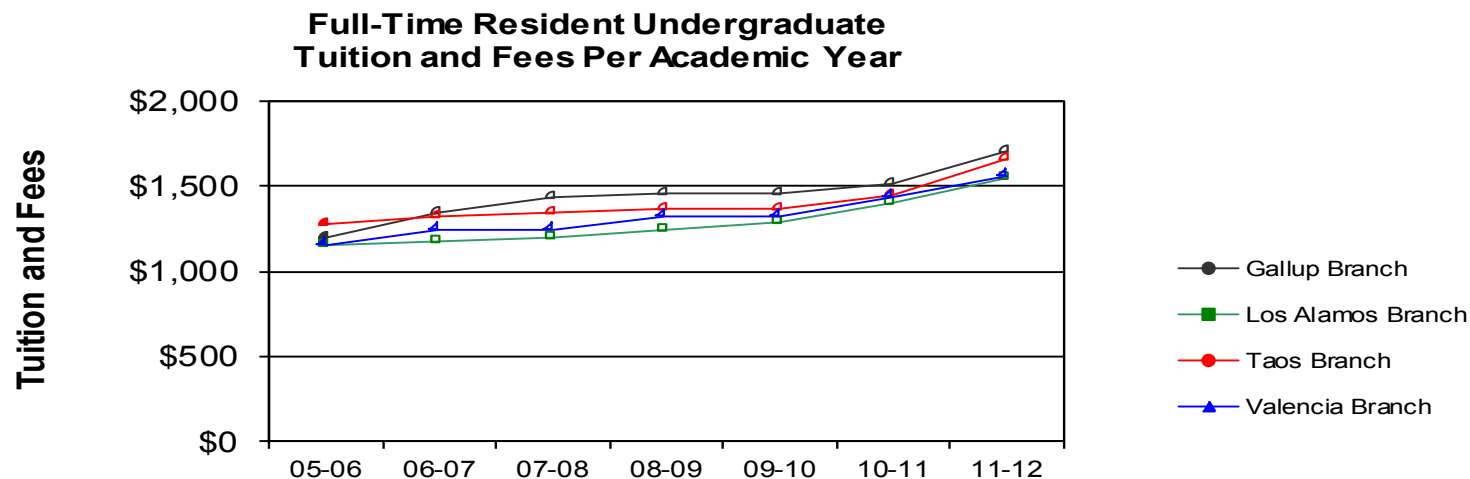

List of UNM Peer Institutions

Peer institutions are selected as a means to benchmark university performance against a set of similar institutions. There is not one ideal set of peers that works for all instances. Sometimes UNM compares itself to public AAU institutions, an aspirational group of high-performing research institutions. Other times UNM compares itself to institutions that have a student body more similar to UNM's (moderately selective, primarily commuter, and with a high percentage of minority students). There are two groups of peers that are often used. The Higher Education Department (HED) set has been used for approximately 20 years, and is the set of peers accepted by the state. The set used for IPEDS comparisons is comprised of public research universities from adjacent states as well as some of the Midwest universities that are in the state grouping.

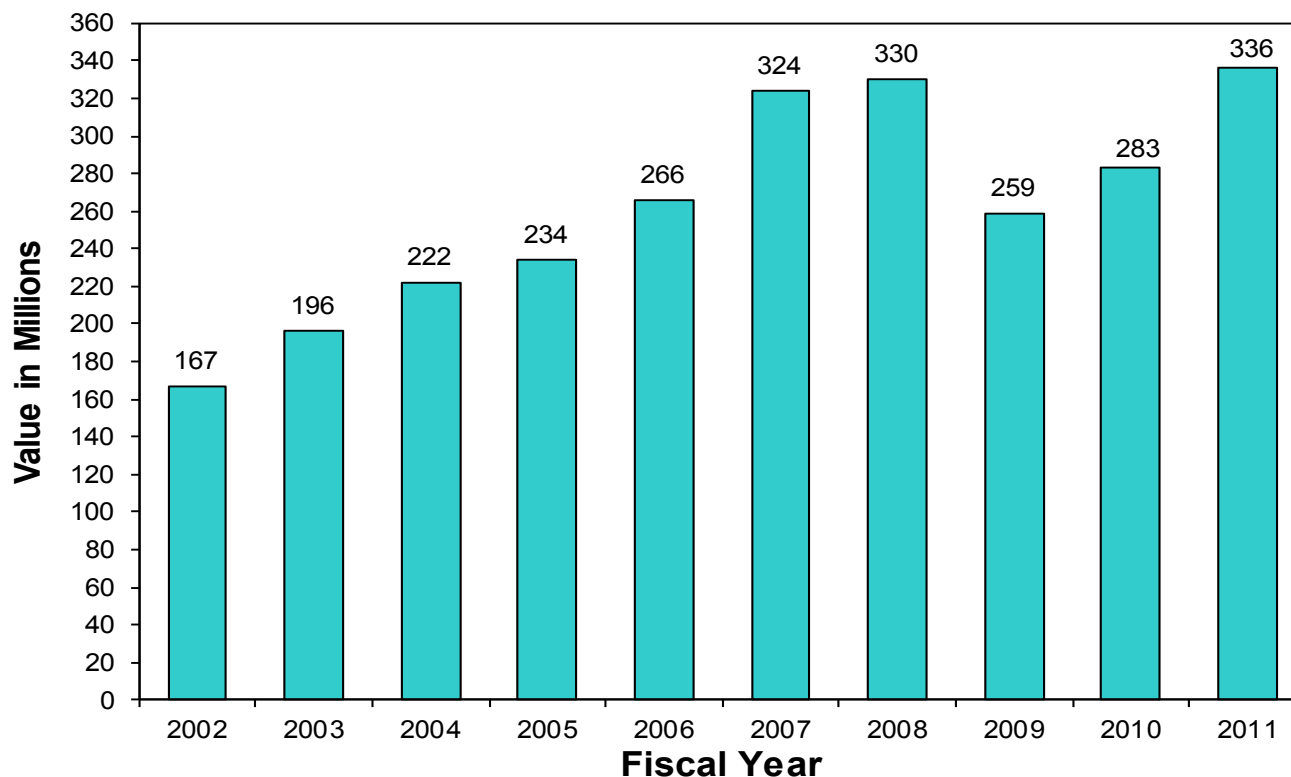

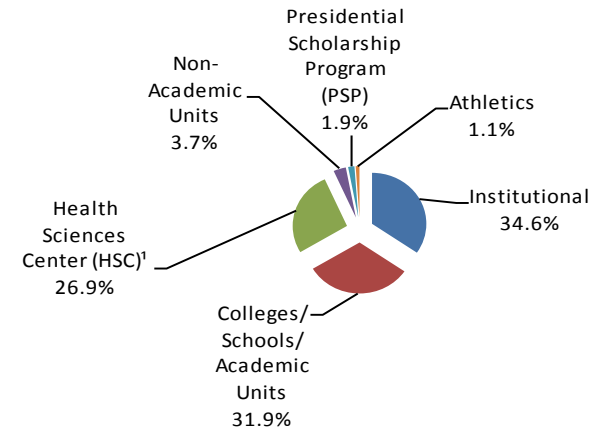

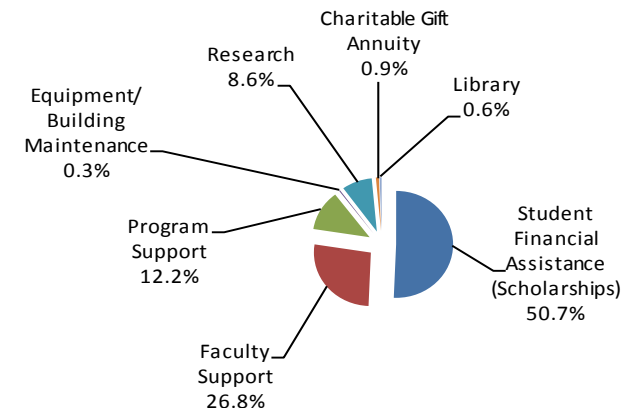

Consolidated Investment Fund (CIF) Disbursements by Purpose (FY 2011)

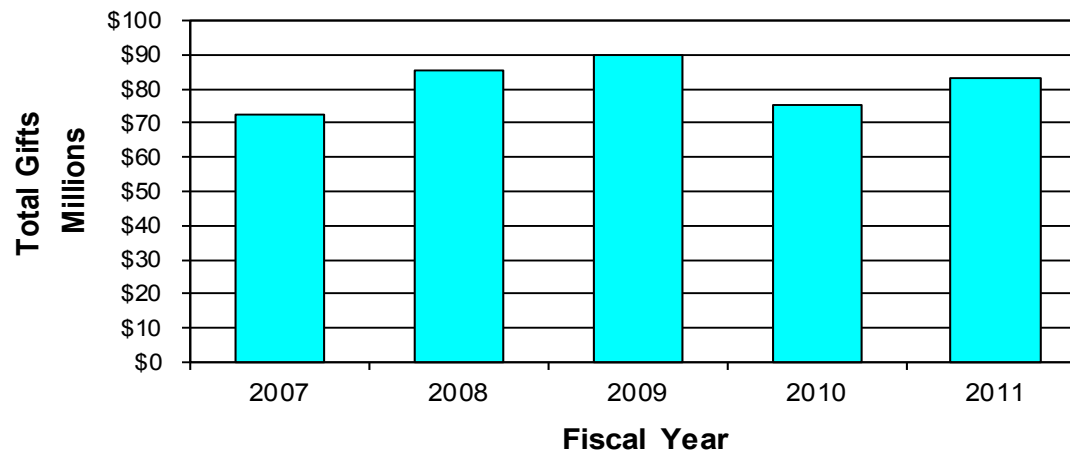

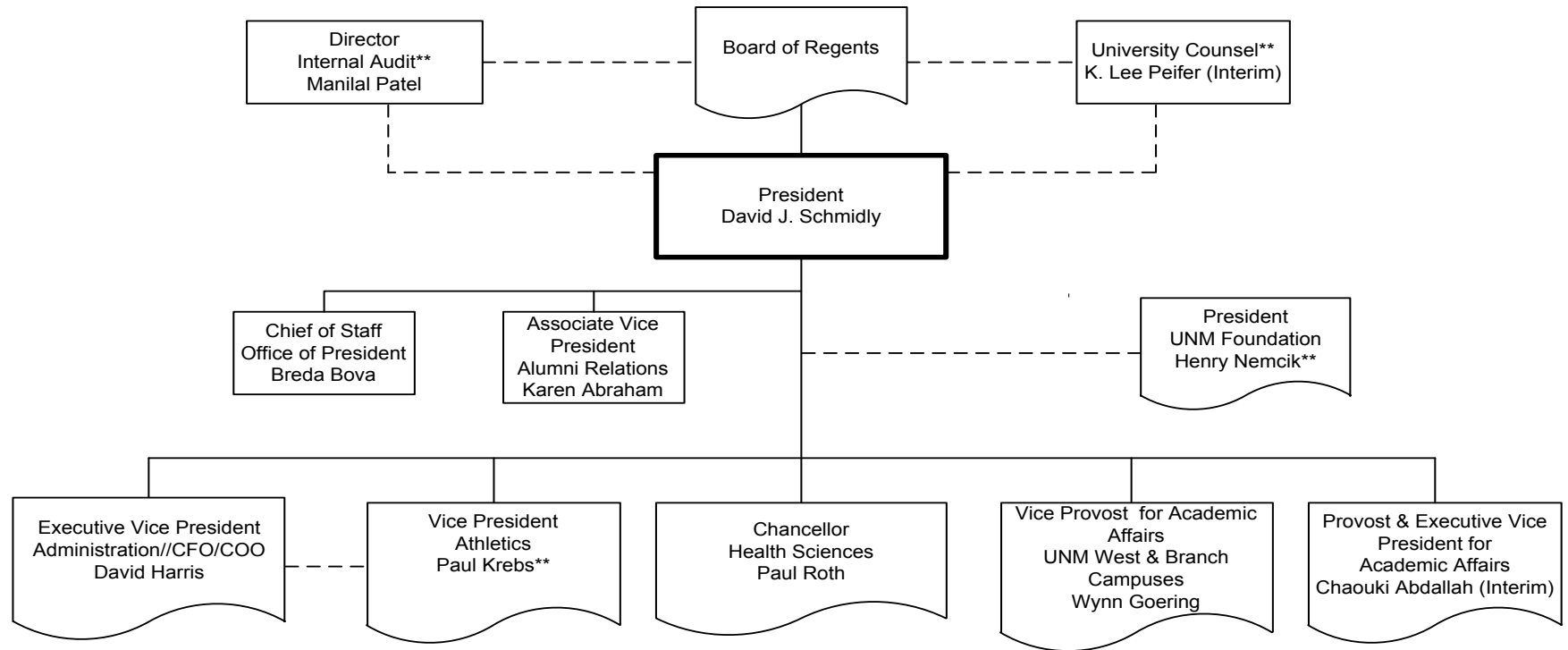

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



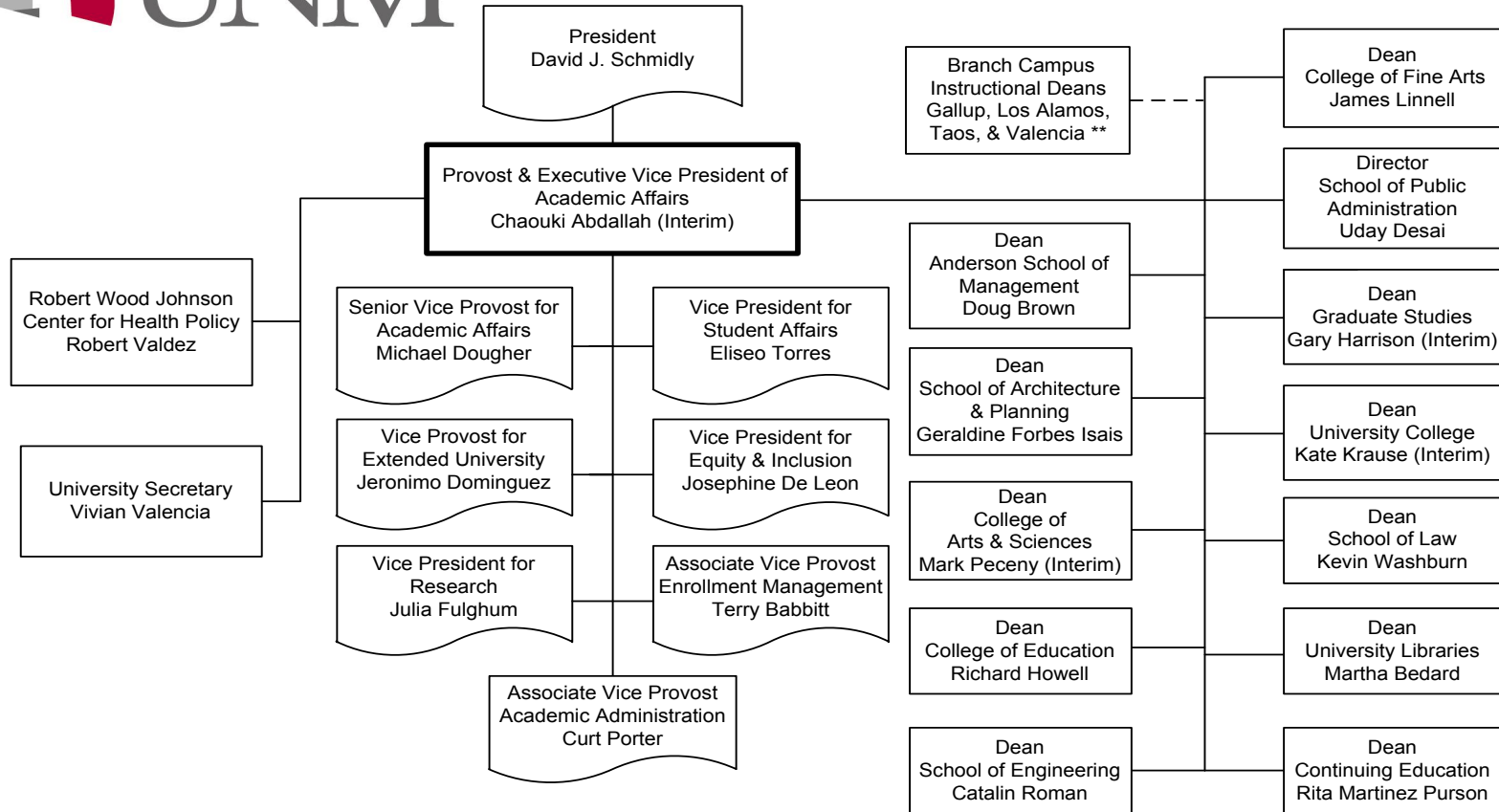

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



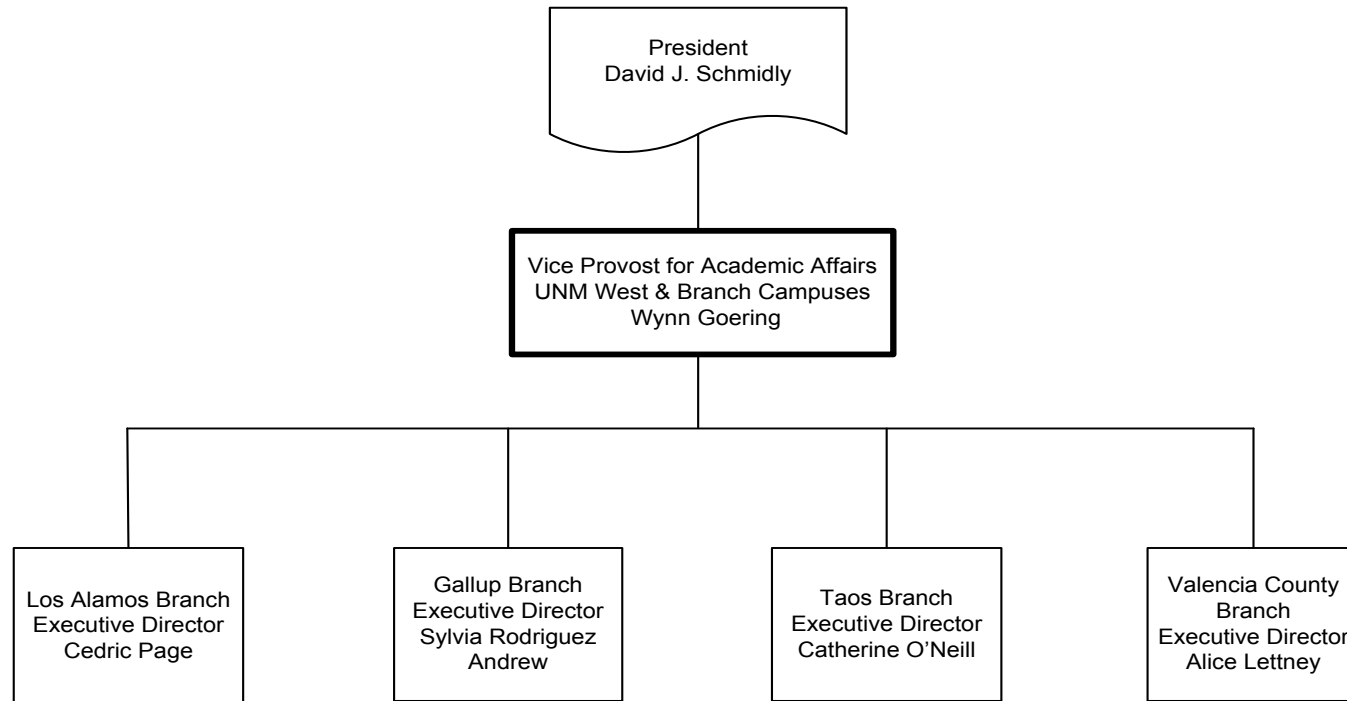

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*

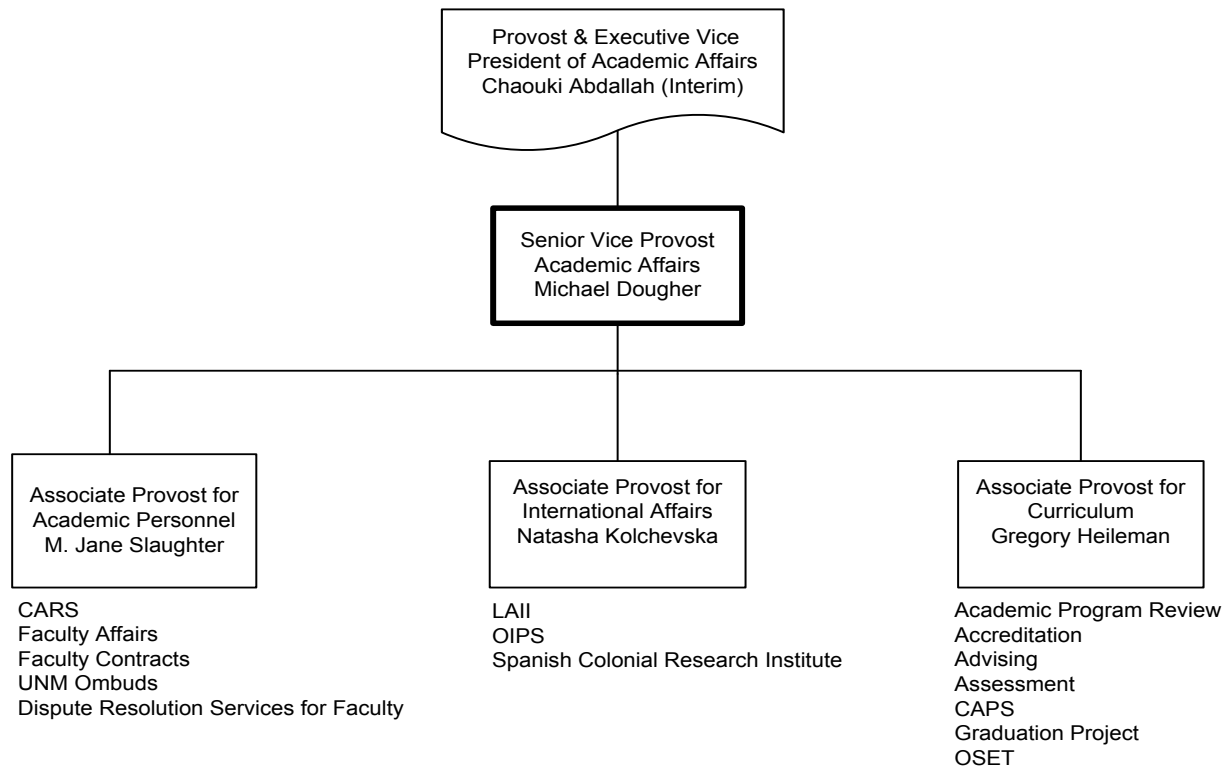

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*

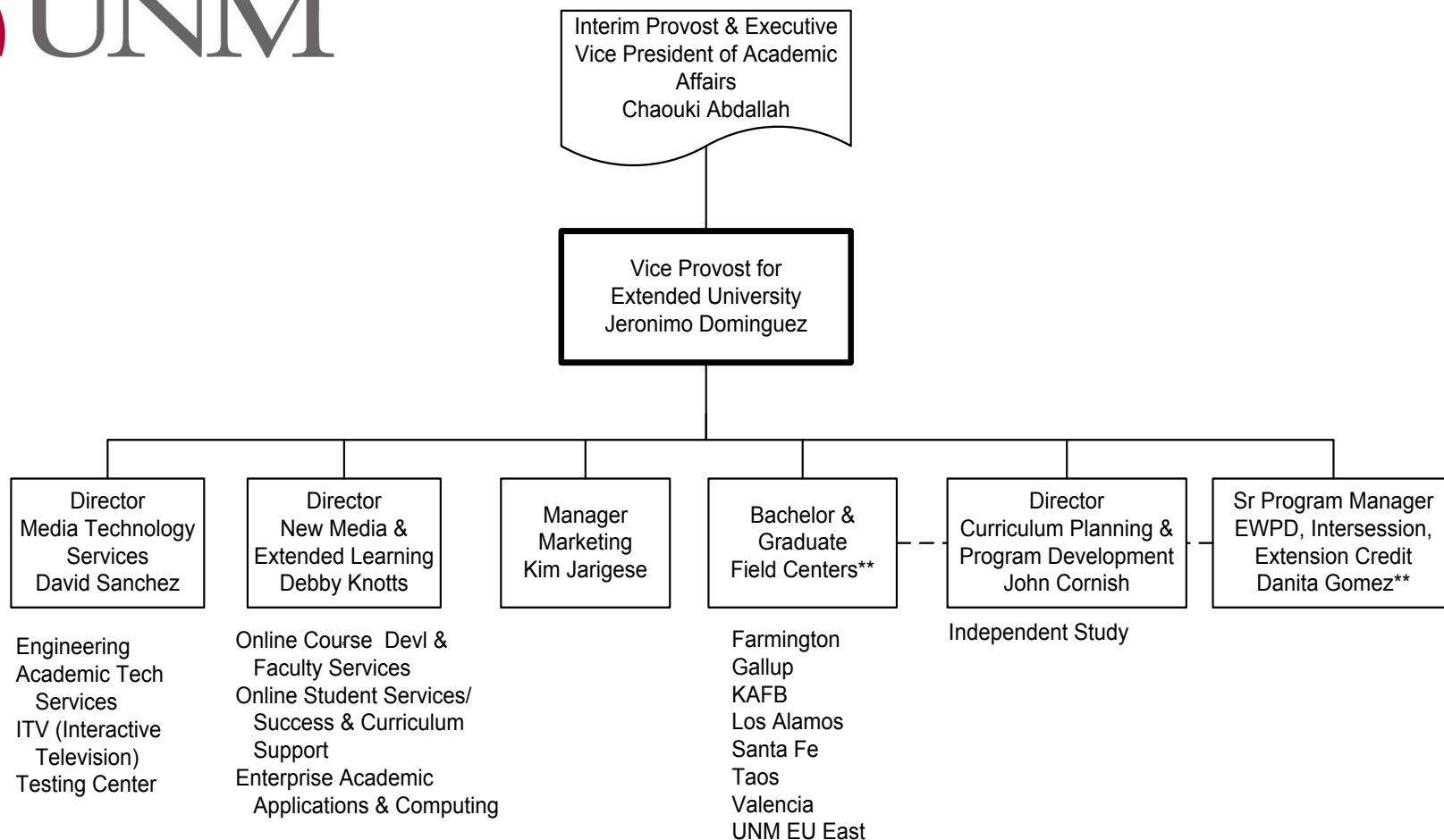

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



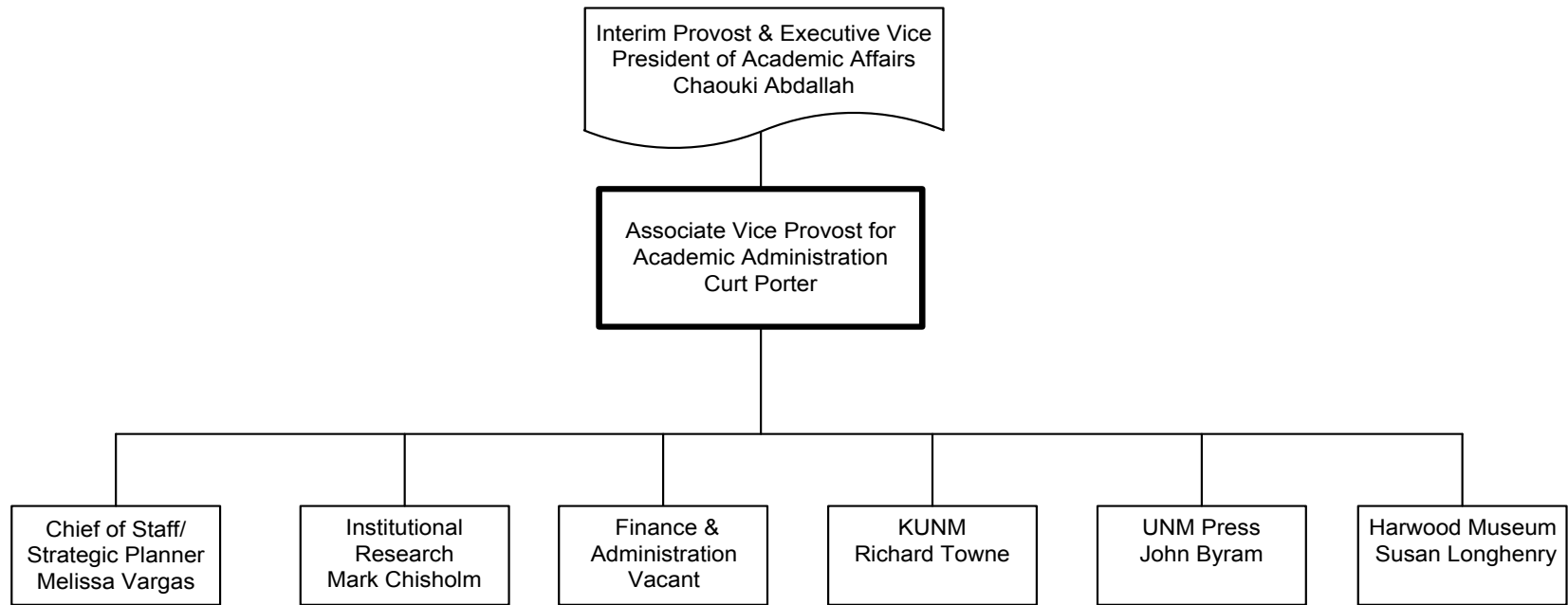

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*

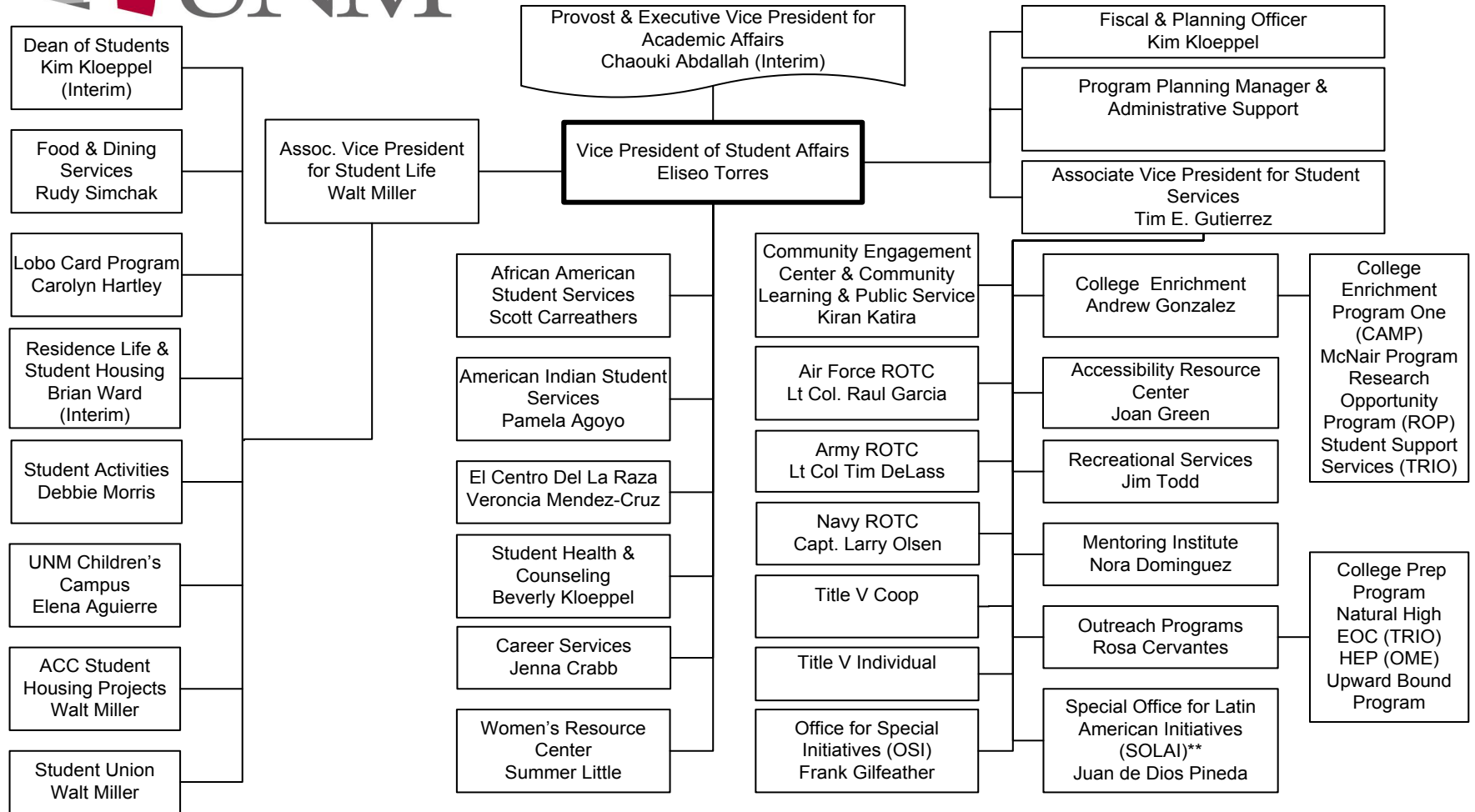

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



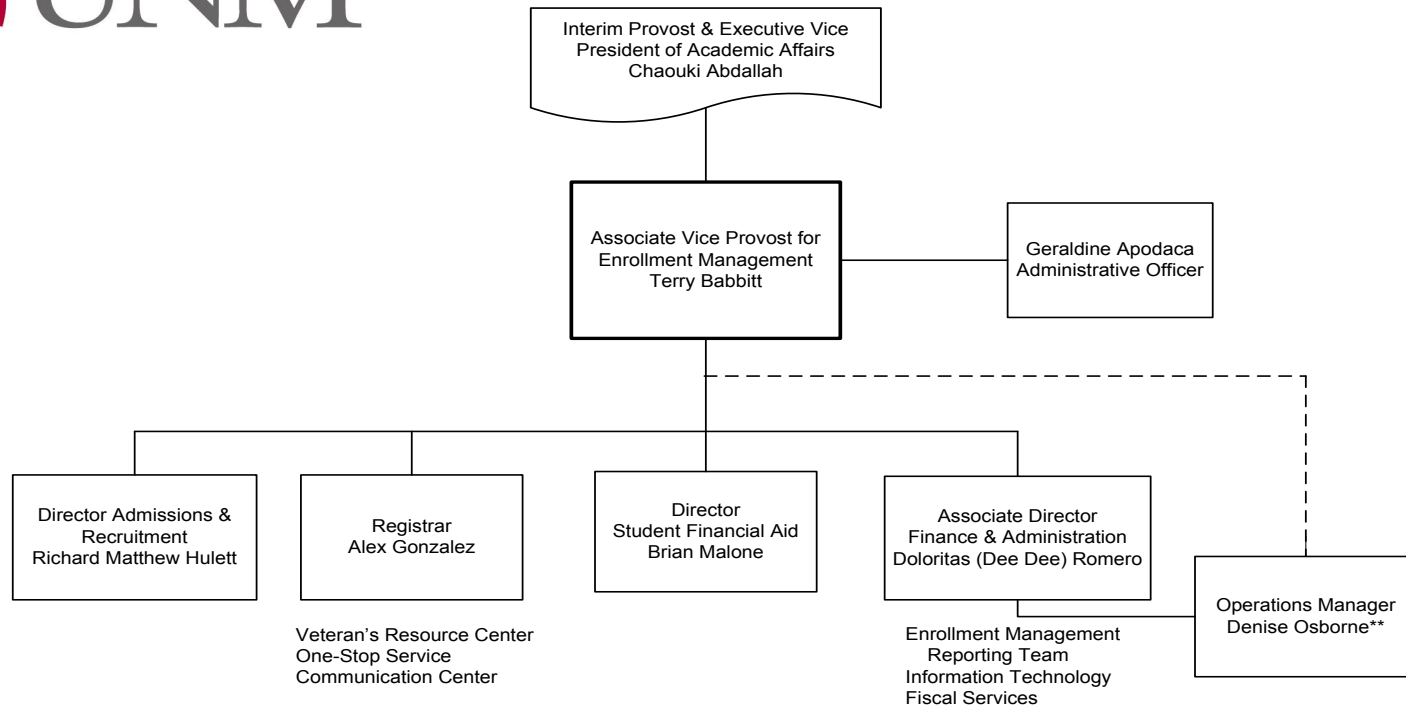

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



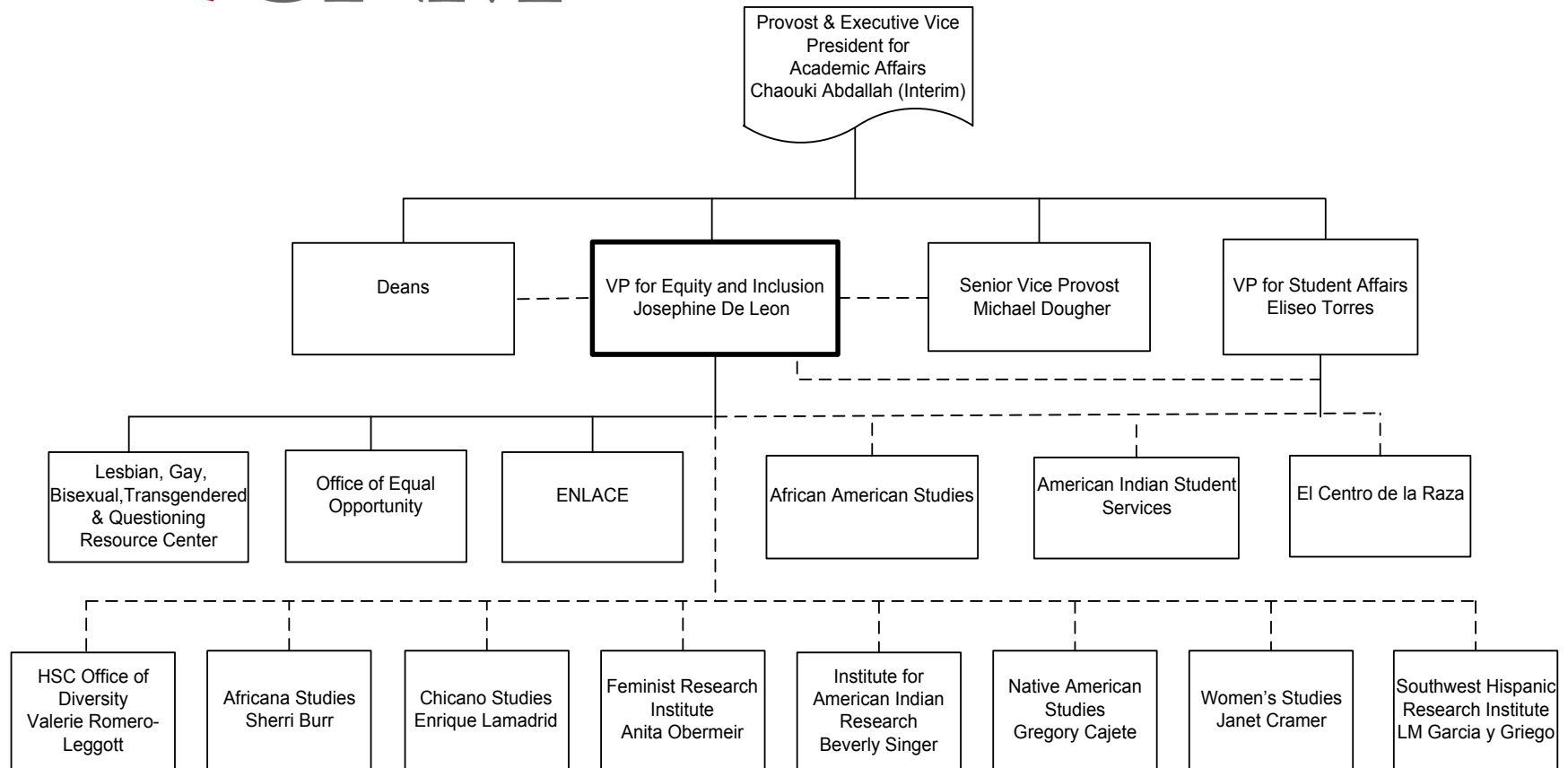

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



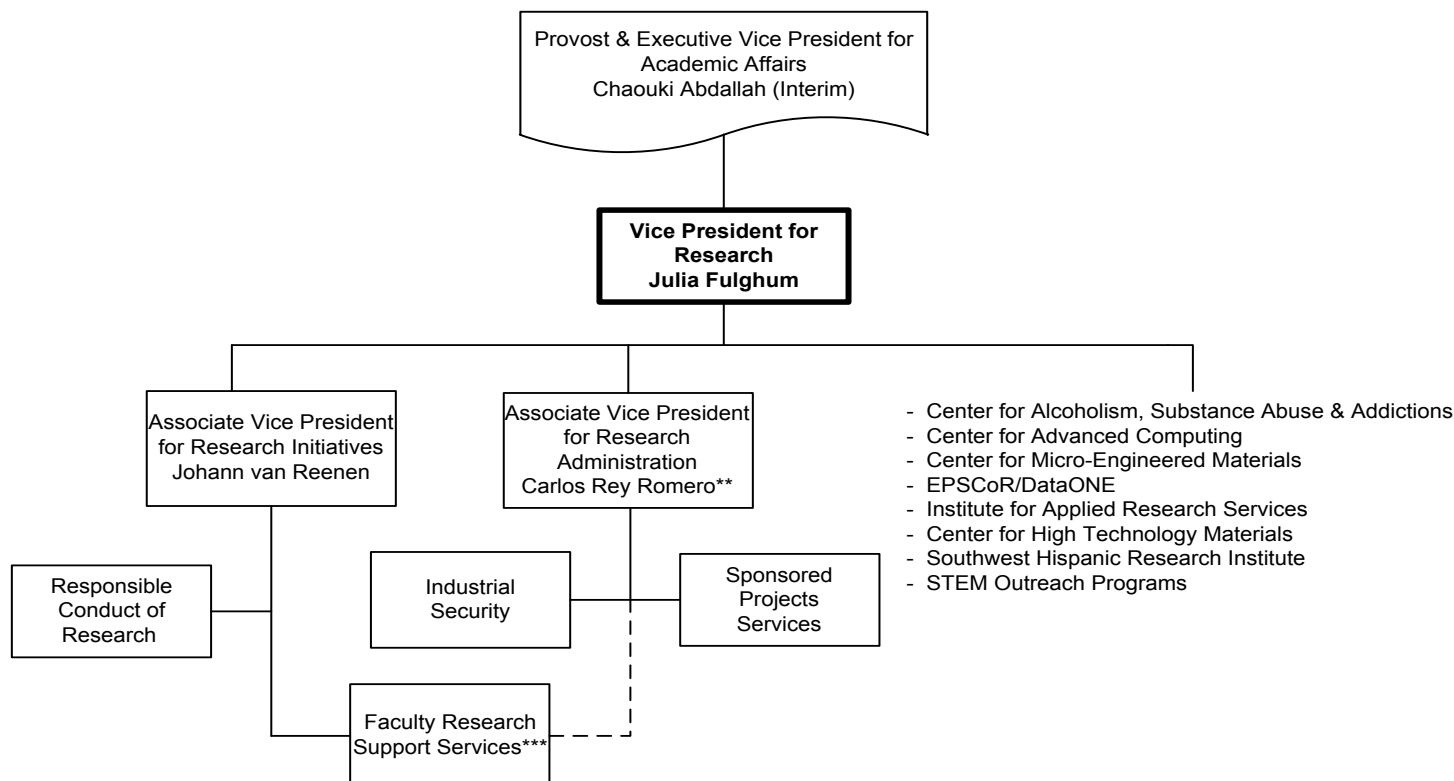

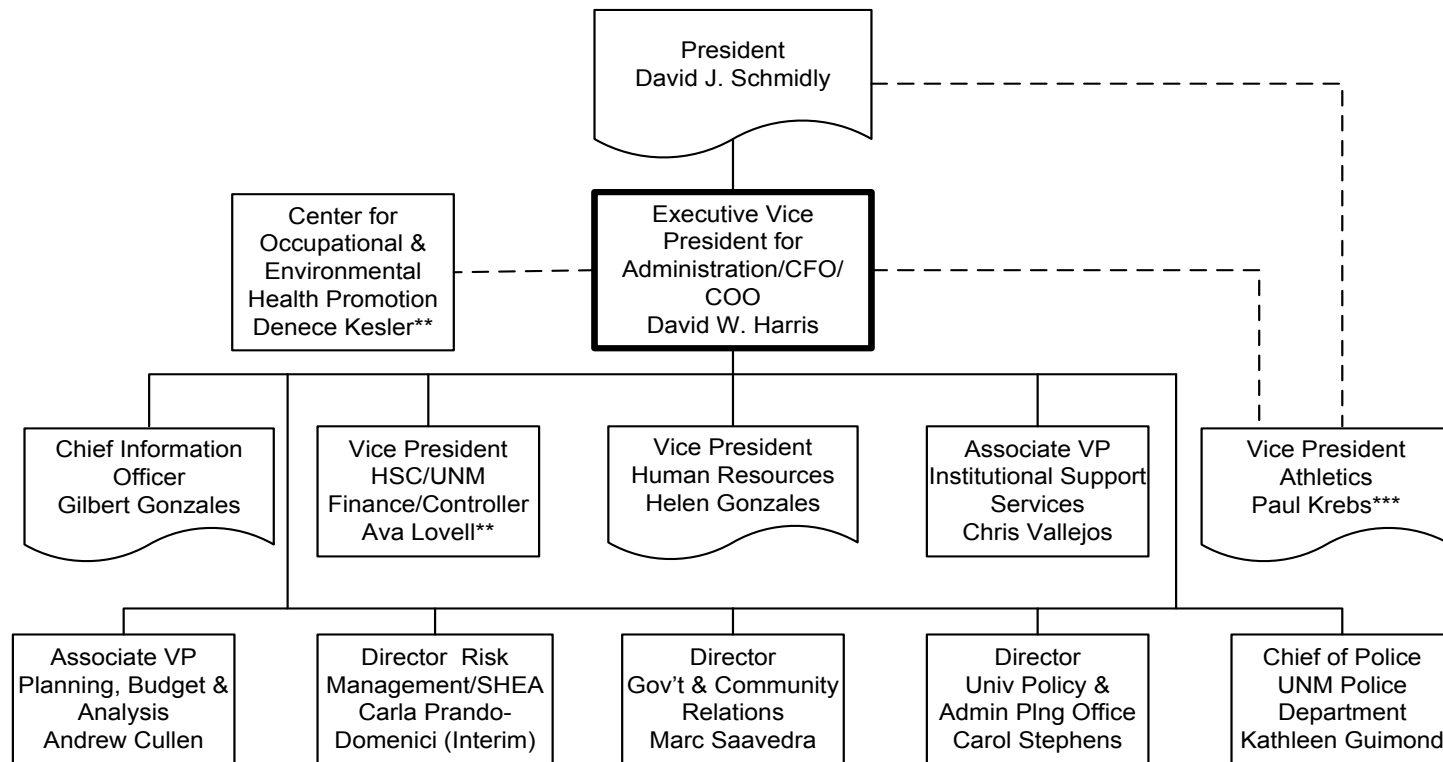

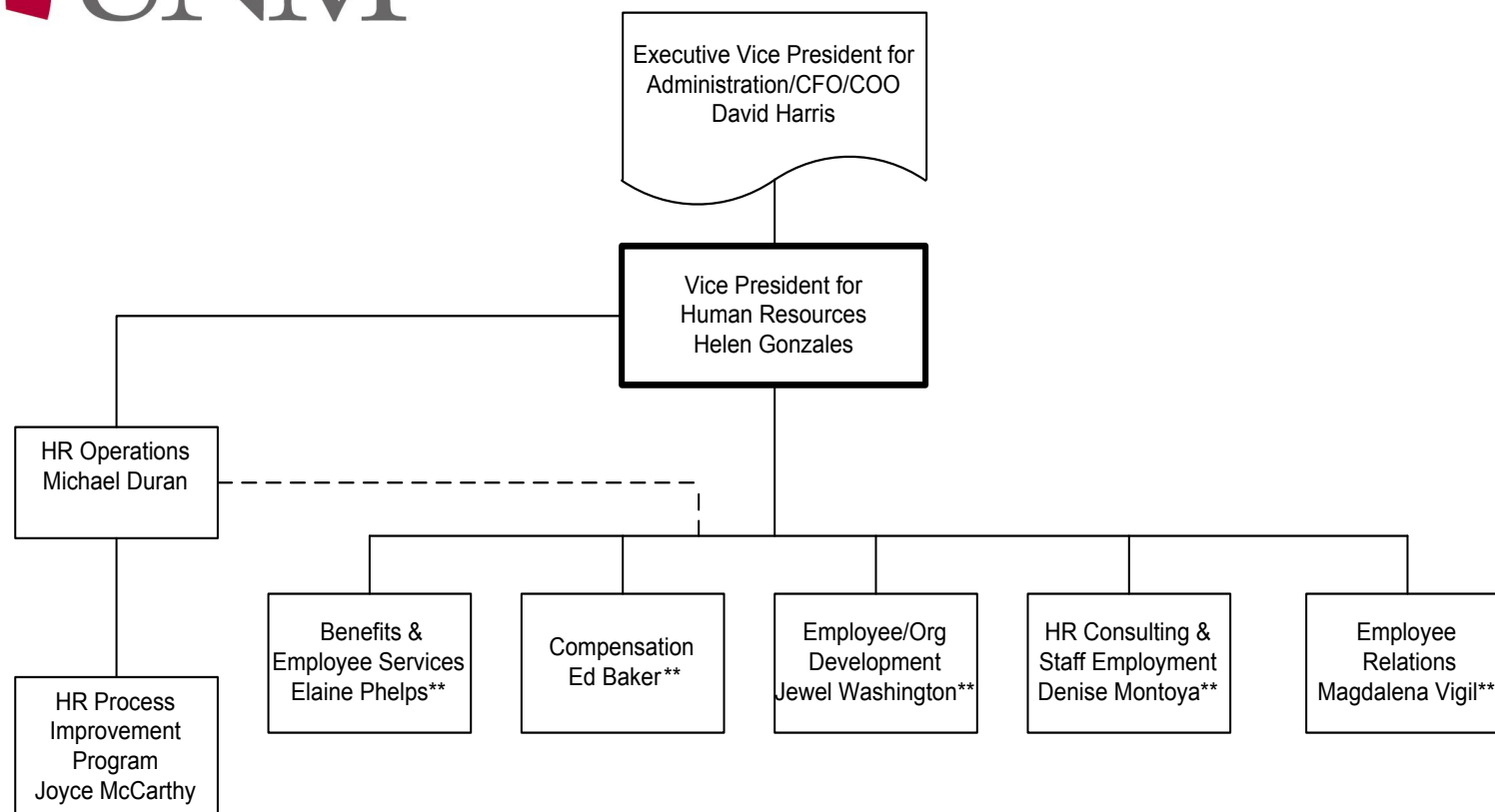

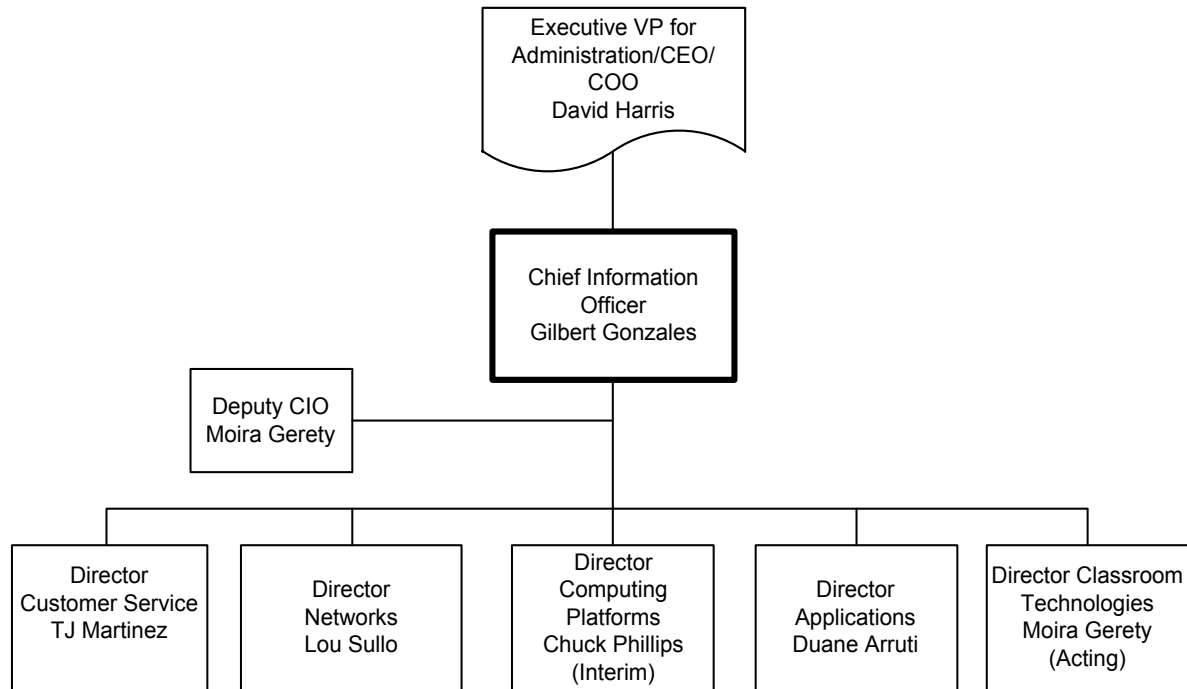

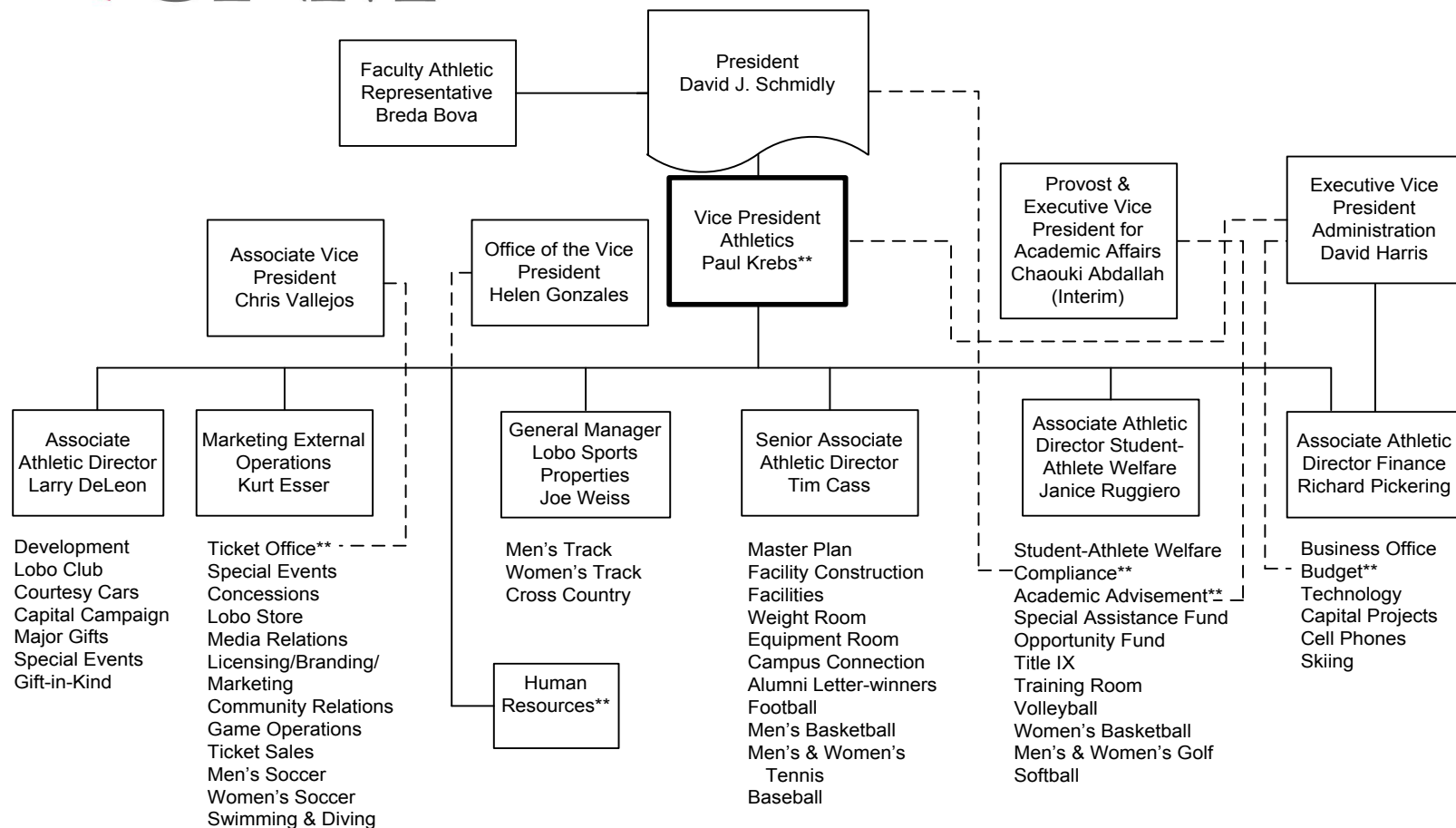

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



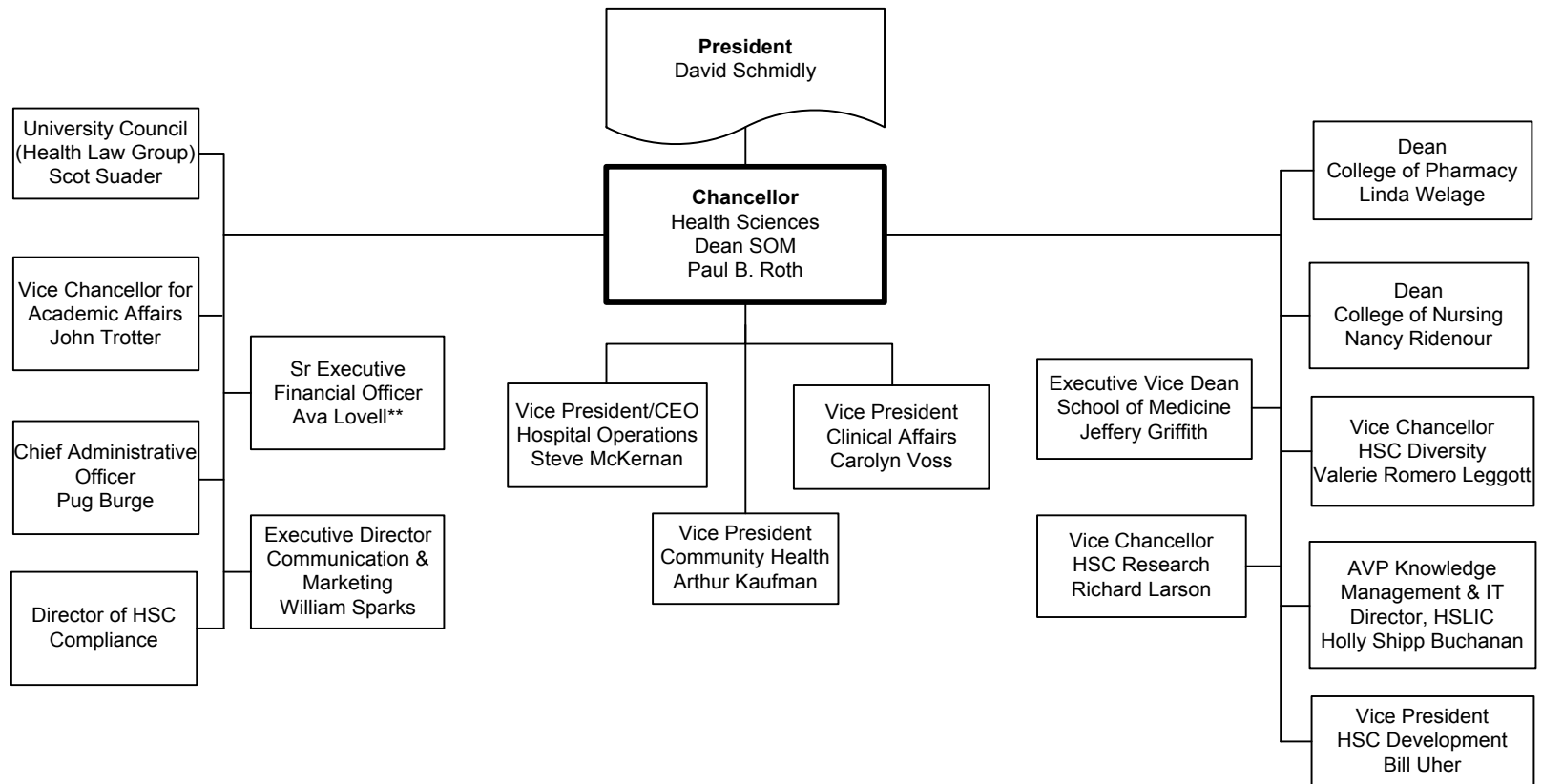

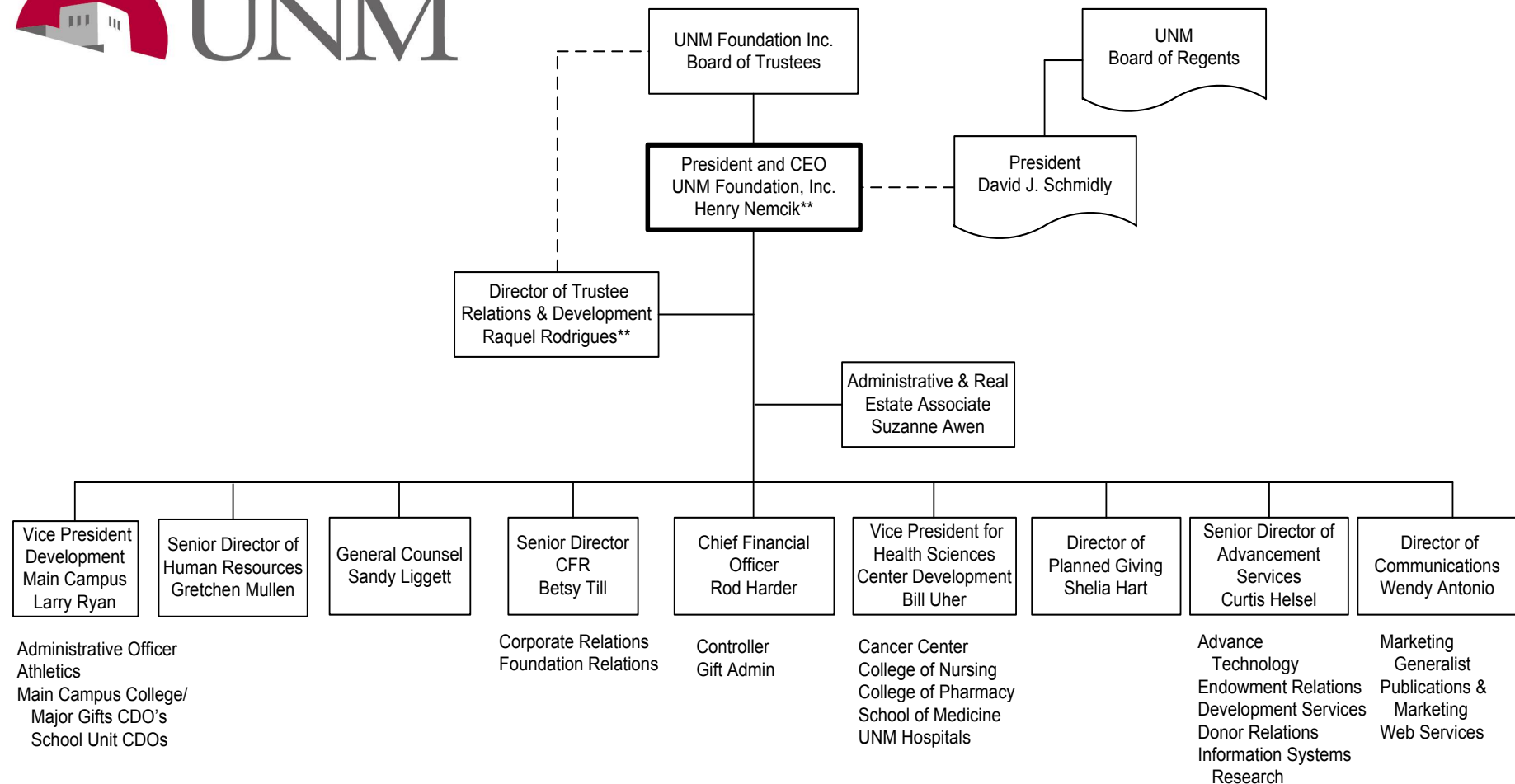

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



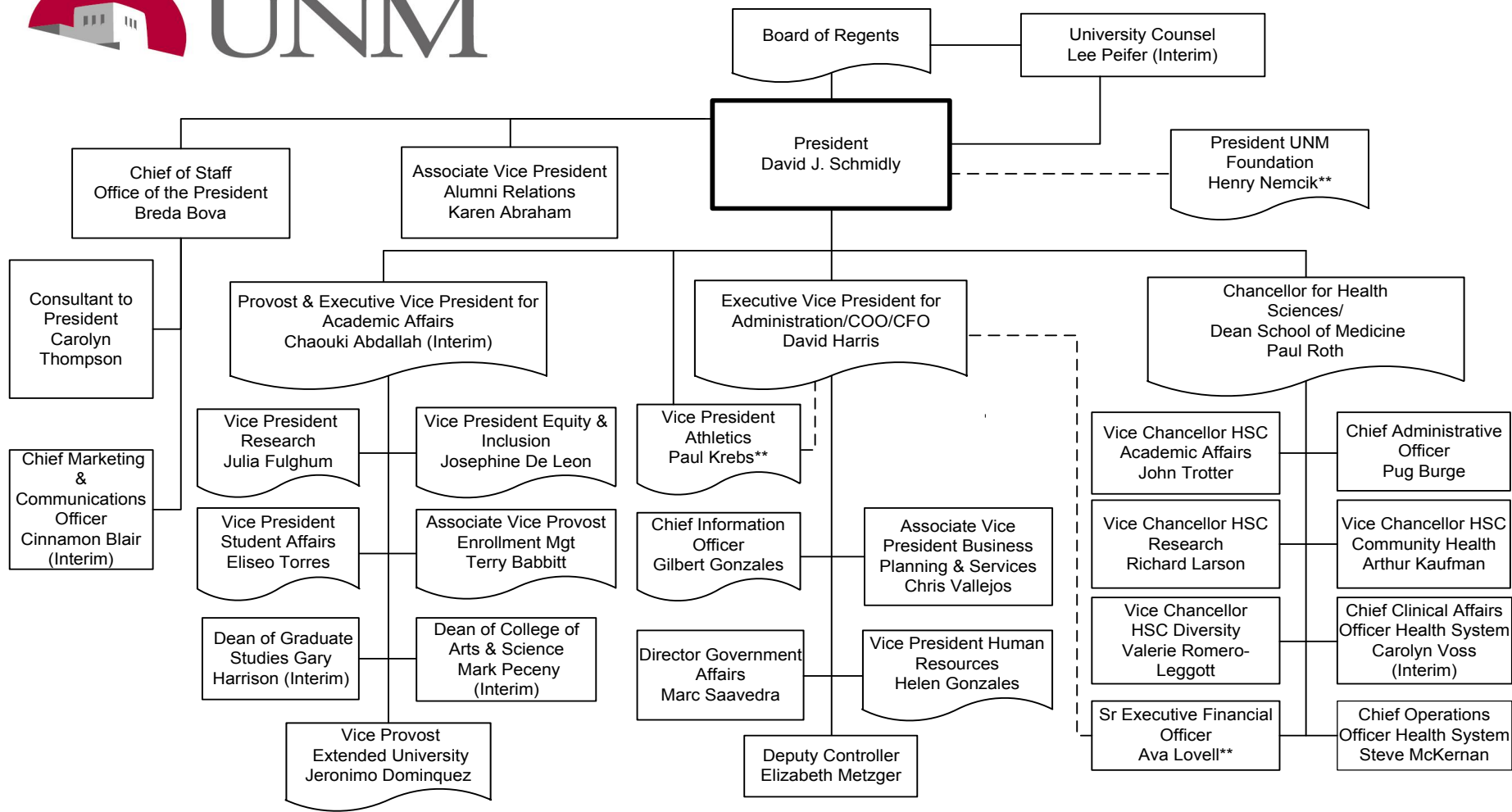

2011-2012 Organizational Structure*



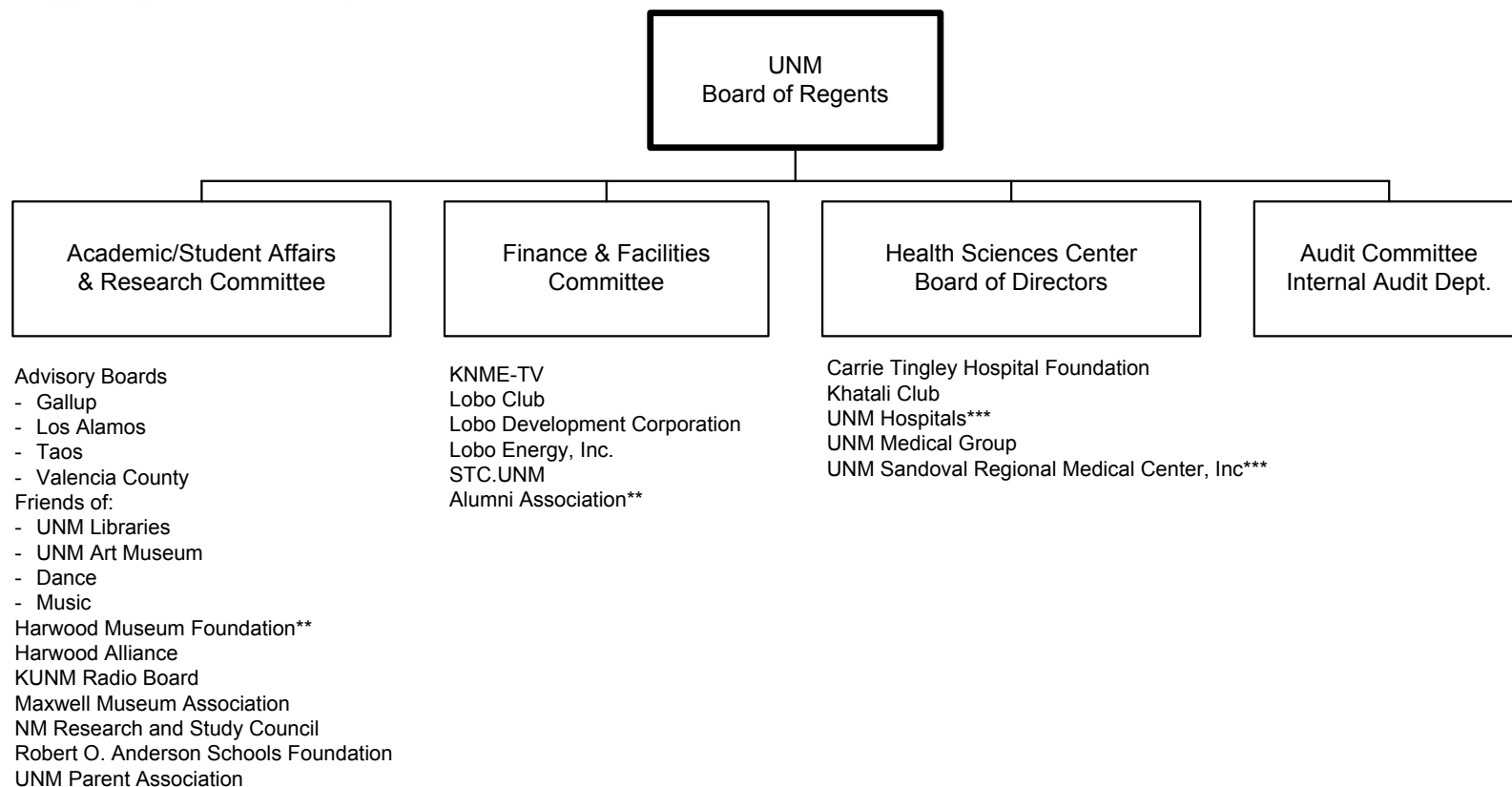
